"CLASS NIGHT" TONIGHT

Program Arranged for Commencement of Alexandria High School Monday Night.

The third annual commencement exercises of the Alexandria High School will be held Monday night at eight o'clock in the Opera House, when the largest class in the history of the school will be graduated, the exact number who will receive the diplomas being not officially known until the examinations of the Seniors today in Algebra is over. Monday's night's graduation ceremonies will be probably the best and largest since the founding of the school.

William Allen Wells, one of the honor pupils of the graduating class, has been given the honor of delivering the valedictory, and John Underwood Reardon has been selected to give the salutatory. The commencement address will be delivered by the Hon. Charles C. Carlin, United States representative from the eighth district of Virginia. The rest of the program is made up of the presentation of medals and the awarding of promotion certificates to A. H. S. undergraduates, together with the singing of a number of beautiful songs by the High School chorus, a hundred voices strong.

8. Delivery of certificates and diplomas, with honorable mention in High School scholarship.
9. Valedictory address—William Allen Wells.
10. Benediction—Rev. J. W. Duffey.

The baccalaureate sermon to the graduates of the Alexandria High School will be preached by the Rev. William J. Morton at Christ Church tomorrow night. The High School chorus will sing at this service.

The "Class Night" exercises of the graduating class will be held tonight at Lee Camp Hall at 8 o'clock. At this time a program of extremely interesting features will be rendered by the Seniors and a number of the High School faculty are expected to make short speeches. Members of the Junior Class are the guests of honor. Thursday afternoon the Juniors entertained the Seniors on an excursion to Marshall Hall. The two classes left on the early afternoon boat to the resort and returned late that night. The public is cordially invited to attend the graduation exercises Monday night.

GRAND JURY MONDAY

Joseph Henderson Will be Indicted for Murdering His Brother, Joseph Henderson.

When the grand jury of the Corporation Court meets on Monday Samuel G. Brent, commonwealth attorney, will present an indictment against Joseph Henderson for murder in the first degree. Henderson shot and killed his brother, John Henderson, on the night of April 25th, and has been confined in the city jail since that time.

An indictment charging murder with intent to kill will also be presented against William Quill. Quill, while an inmate of the city jail undergoing a sentence of six months for cutting a negro, made a knife out of a corset steel and attacked William Brown, a fellow prisoner. The offense took place on May 17th.

William Jeffries, Robert Dunbar and Lewis White, three colored boys, will be charged with entering the store of Aaron Katz, on April 28th, and David Smith will be charged with cutting Pearl Jackson.
