

BRYAN CAN EARN \$137,000

By Lecturing He Could Make That Sum in a Year

The large earning power of William J. Bryan as lecturer is not generally known by the public. An estimate has been made, that by devoting his attention to the Chautauquas and lyceums the former secretary of State can earn at his present scale of prices more than \$137,000 a year.

With Mr Bryan's physical strength it is possible for him to deliver three lectures a day, and he has done it on more than one tour.

Mr Bryan's terms for lecturing are as follows: He receives a guarantee of \$250 for each lecture. After that amount is taken in at the gate he and the management divide the remainder equally, Mr. Bryan's share sometimes runs over \$500 for a lecture, but it will average \$350 for the season, it is estimated. This would give him an income of \$4,200 a week or \$58,800 for Chautauqua season of fourteen weeks.

During the remaining thirty eight weeks of the year it is estimated, Mr. Bryan could average six lectures a week, which would give him a gross income of \$2,000 a week, or \$79,800 for the thirty eight weeks. This added to the \$58,800 for the Chautauqua season, would give him an income for the year of \$137,800. His expenses would be small outside of the cost of traveling.

From these figures it will be seen that in leaving the post of Secretary of State with its \$12,000 salary, Mr. Bryan is not making any financial sacrifices. He could rest half the year and still have an income nearly as large as that of the President.

DELICATE OPERATION

North Carolinian Has Only Two Inches of Stomach Left

Baltimore, June 14—Although he is 56 years old, Meyer Coplan, a prominent merchant of Newberry, N. C., who is a patient at the Maryland University Hospital, is learning under the direction of a trained nurse to eat.

The reason for these lessons is that he has no stomach or at least has only a little less than two inches left of the stomach which he had when he came to Baltimore about two weeks ago.

The merchant had been suffering for years from a tumor and came here to consult Dr. J. C. Hemmeter, who is an authority on such diseases. After a diagnosis of the case the patient was turned over to Dr. Randolph Winslow for operation. It was found necessary to cut away the organ until there was only a small flap at the esophagus end. It was a problem to join this to the duodenum, a part of the small intestine.

By careful manipulation the two ends were joined together by the operating surgeon and Mr. Hemmeter. The next problem was to supply food that would be digested.

It is said that this patient is one of a half dozen who are living without a stomach. So well has he responded to the treatment that he is now able to walk about, although the operation was performed only two weeks ago. The nurse will accompany him home when he is able to leave the hospital.

How can a man live without a stomach? is the question asked. When eating a meal of some easily digested food, he must stand all the time. It is planned to allow him a spoonful of food at a time. The meal extends over nearly two hours. Quick lunches are tabooed for him.
