

LAST NIGHT'S BANQUET ROLL CALL OF LODGE SERVICES AT CEMETERY

One Hundred Members of Seminole Tribe and Friends Gather at Young People's Building

The annual banquet of Seminole Tribe, No. 35, Improved Order of Red Men, took place last night in the Young People's Building and was attended by 100 members of the tribe and their friends. The music was furnished by the American Indian Guards' Band. Walter S. Nicklin, past great sachem of Virginia, presided as toastmaster and speeches were made as follows:

"My State and Your State", Representative Hatton W. Summers, of Texas.

"American Indian Guards", the Rev. J. W. Duffey, pastor of Washington Street Methodist Church.

"Our Great Reservation," Hon. Charles C. Carlin, this city.

"Our Adopted Brethren," Urban H. Nester, past great sachem, Ohio.

"Our Order," H. Noel Garner, this city.

"Preparedness," Conrad Johnson, principal of the Alexandria High School.

"The Great Council of Virginia," Roger C. Sullivan, great senior saganor.

There was a vocal solo by Clarence V. Sutton and vocal duet by Miss Catherine Billheimer and Edward Billheimer.

Stereopticon views of President Wilson and Representative Carlin were shown during the progress of the banquet.

Ernest R. Boyer, Grand Outer Guard of the Knights of Pythias of Virginia, has secured the Hon. Benjamin Hilliard, of Colorado, as the orator on the occasion of the Roll Call of Oriental Lodge of this city on June 6th. Among other distinguished visitors to be present are Grand Chancellor Dickman, Supreme Representative Kahlerl and Past Grand Chancellor Kimmell, of the domain, of Washington, D. C.

The visitors will be met by a committee from Oriental Lodge and conducted to their hall on North Pitt street, where the exercises will take place. Mr. Talbot Pulizzi, one of Washington's well known Shakespearean actors, will be present and render selections.

Oriental Lodge is one of Alexandria's oldest organizations. The lodge was formed in the early part of 1869. Mechanics' Lodge was organized the preceding year, and the meetings were held in what was then known as Phenix Hall, northwest corner of King and Royal streets. Pythianism took immediate root in Alexandria, and the formation of Oriental Lodge soon followed. Its roster bore the names of representative Alexandrians at its birth, as it does in its mature years.

BOLT KILLS THREE IN BARN.

Three Girls and Two Youths Buried When Lightning Demolishes Building.

Philadelphia, May 26—Two girls and a young man was killed and another girl and a youth were injured yesterday, when lightning demolished an abandoned barn in which they had sought refuge from the storm. All five were buried under tons of debris.

The dead are: Marie Wheaton, 16 years old; Florence Elizabeth Smith, 18 years old and Louis White, 23 years old.

The accident was only one of a long list caused by a freak thunder-shower which rolled over the city late in the afternoon, leaving in its wake more damage to life and property than any storm that has visited this city in years.

Several fires were started by lightning. In the most severe of these two women and a man were severely burned and a third woman has not been accounted for. Panic was imminent among 400 children assembled in the chapel of the Carmelite convent, at Oak Lane, when a ball of fire burst through the huge rose window behind the altar and passed out the other end of the edifice. Thousands of dollars' worth of property was destroyed by the tornado which accompanied the downpour. The storm broke at 4:15 o'clock, and in less than two hours more than an inch of rain had fallen, flooding streets and sewers. Cellars were filled with water in many parts of the city.
