

MILITARY MAY VOTE

Thanks to T. P. A., Virginia Soldiers Can Cast Ballot From Mexico.

Even though fighting in Mexico it is now possible for any member of the state militia, eligible for citizenship, to cast his vote in any Virginia election.

Though the law was made primarily for traveling men, militia in service was also provided for Virginia is so far the only state whose citizen soldiery can vote from without the country's boundaries.

Providing the following instructions are carefully complied with the voter need have no fear of his vote being properly counted or his voice in the government not being heard:

1. Notify the registrar of your precinct not less than thirty days before the election in which you desire to vote.

2. Be sure to write plainly your name and home address, so that the registrar may identify you on his poll book.

3. Write plainly name of the regiment to which you desire the blank ballot to be registered for you.

4. Take notice that the registered letter containing the ballot will not reach you until about fifteen days prior to election day, as the ballots are not ordered to be printed by the electoral board until twenty days prior to election.

5. On receipt of the letter containing the ballot at the general delivery window, you must open and mark the ballot in the presence of the commanding officer or the officer delegated by him for the purpose, send it in the return envelope provided, sign the voucher on the envelope and have the postmaster, his assistant or a notary witness it.

6. Having sealed the return envelope, register it at once, and forward same to the registrar of your precinct, requesting that a return card be sent to assure you of its receipt by him.

7. Be sure your registered letter containing the ballot is mailed in time to reach your registrar by the day of election, as your vote will not be counted if received after the closing of the polls.

Militiamen who are not registered should do so at once and carry with them the name and address of their respective registrars so that they may mail their votes to the proper authority.
