**JOHN MILTON'S SUBJECT**  
 Evangelist Gibson Delivers Discourse Upon War in Heaven at Gospel Tent

"War Between Christ and Satan," was the theme of Evangelist Gibson at the gospel tent on north Washington street last night. The speaker in the course of his address said:
