

BET CHILD A YEAR

Beaver Falls Couple, Republicans, Make Strange Wager With Democratic Friends

Beaver Falls, Pa., Aug. 1.—"That we shall have a child every year for the rest of our natural lives if Wilson is re-elected president of the United States in 1916," is the strange wager Mr. and Mrs. Henry Du Prele, Republicans, of Beaver Falls, have made with Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Greene, Democrats, of New Brighton, to take effect in 1917. Mr. and Mrs. Greene have placed \$200 as their side of the bet.

"I hardly look for Mr. Wilson to be re-elected," Mr. Du Prele told a newspaper man today, "although should he be, my wife and I will carry out our part of the agreement." Both Mr. and Mrs. Du Prele are young people, the husband being twenty-seven and his wife twenty-four; they already have three children, and should they lose in the wager Mr. Du Prele figures they should have at least twenty-five children before the end of their natural lives.

BOLT FINDS GAS WELL.

Non-Producing Oiler Changes Its Fuel For Lightning.

Pittsburgh, Aug. 1.—An oil well belonging to the Harbison and Walker Company, in Hays, and long classed as a non-producer, is flowing gas enough every 24 hours to add \$50 to the wealth of the owners, and a bolt of lightning turned the trick Sunday.

When the fire department attempted to extinguish the flames, it was found that a heavy flow of gas was coming from the well. After much difficulty this was diverted into a feed pipe, and is now going through the meter at a rate of nearly 1,500,000 feet every 24 hours.

Licenses Must Be Secured From the Authorities Before Indulging In Sport

Licenses for gunning in any part of the state of Virginia may be procured by Alexandria residents from the clerk of the corporation court only, in the future, according to Virginia's new law, which went into effect July 1, of this year.

Heretofore, a person wishing to hunt in any particular county of the state had to secure the license from the authorities of that county. Now, however, it has all been changed, and licenses are secured from the authorities of the community of which the would-be nimrod is a resident.

Gunning licenses for the following season may be secured between the period extending from July 1, 1916, to June 30, 1917, according to the new hunting law.

The season begins September 1. To shoot in any one county of the state of Virginia costs a Virginian one dollar, while the sum of three dollars secures a license to hunt in any part of the state. Licenses to shoot in any part of the state cost non-residents of the state ten dollars.

Clerk of the Courts Nevell S. Greenaway has issued four gunning licenses to date.

KAISER "ON STUMP"

Inaugurates Propaganda to Prepare Public Mind for End of Great War.

Berlin, Aug. 1.—The Kaiser today inaugurated a speechmaking propaganda throughout Germany to unify the empire on Germany's peace terms and to prepare the public mind for peace.

Under the auspices of German national committee, an organization having the approval of the official censorship, fifty well-known German orators will make the same speech in fifty German cities today. The speech is unofficially known to represent Chancellor von Bethmann-Hollweg's peace term views.
