DEPARTURE OF FIREMEN PAID \$10 FOR SPEEDING REGATTA ON LABOR DAY

Nearly All Volunteers in Department Take Train For Harrisonburg This Morning.

King Street This Morning in Eleven Seconds.

Will Compete in Centipede Events.

Practically all of the volunteer firemen of Alexandria left the city on the 8:47 train for Harrisonburg this morning, to attend the annual convention of the Virginia Firemen's Association, which will be in session at the Rockingham county city from Wednesday, August 23, to Friday, August 25, inclusive. Names of delegates and alternates, representing the three local companies, were announced in yesterday's issue of the Gazette.

This morning thirty-five firemen of Hampton, Va., were in the city, or their way to Harrisonburg. They left with the Alexandria laddies, who boarded a special coach in the handsome blue uniforms that marks the fireman.

Harrisonburg will be reached by the Alexandrians, accompanied by their Hampton brothers, late this afternoon, and the convention will officially open to-morrow morning. The Rockingham city is in gala attire for the affair, and, according to all advices is preparing to outdo itself in hospitality to the visitors. There will be many hundreds of firemen present from all parts of the state.

There were but three cases before the Police Court this morning. Louis Bun had been arrested on a charge of assaulting Alberta Brent. He failed to appear when his name was called and forfeited his collateral.

Edward Brice, colored, was charged with harboring an unlicensed dog. In the absence of evidence the case was continued.

At an early hour this morning Officer Miller had his attention directed to the high rate of speed of an automobile which was running east from the union passenger station. He pulled out his watch and saw that the autoist had run more than a square in eleven seconds. The man, who gave his name as Milton Jeters, was arrested and brought before the Police Court at 9 o'clock. After Officer Miller had given his evidence Officer Thompson alleged that Jeter ran the machine at an unlawful speed while on his way to the station house. Jeter then asked if he had any defense to make, said he did not know he was making unlawful time in the street. He was fined \$10.

There was a special session of the Police Court last night after Officer Kern had arrested a man named Paul Underwood on the charge of disorderly conduct. Underwood was fined \$1, he having plead guilty to the charge. A woman named Emma Spicer was charged by Officer Kern with assault. It was alleged that when the officer entered her house for the purpose of making Underwood in charge he was accompanied by C. A. Lester, who had been summoned to go with him in order to identify the man wanted. The woman grappled with Lester and attempted to throw him down a steep flight of stairs. She was fined \$5.

OF INTEREST TO MOTORISTS.

Residents of the District of Columbia May Motor in Alexandria County.

Motorists of the District of Columbia, who have District license tags upon their machines, may journey through Alexandria county without Virginia license tag without molestation from county authorities, according to assurances given the District bureau of the A. A. A. This action was taken after conference between William Uhlman, secretary of the D. C. club, Alexandria county officials and Governor Henry C. Stuart, who will get an opinion shortly from Attorney-General Pollard regarding the power of the state executive to establish permanent reciprocal relations with other jurisdictions and commonwealths.

In the conference that resulted on the new ruling Alexandria county was represented by Commonwealth's Attorney Frank S. Ball and C. T. Jesse, President of the Alexandria county Civic Federation.

Recently several motorists from the District have been arrested for entering the county minus Virginia tags, and it is thought that this brought about, partly, the request of the District Auto Club for a conference for reciprocal relations.

PREVAILING HOT WAVE.

Mercury Stood at 104 Degrees in Places in Alexandria To-Day.

The depressing torrid wave which allowed the temporary cool spell of last week is still in evidence. The temperature during the past two days has been very oppressive, and the Weather Bureau gives no hope of an early break in present conditions. The mercury in the thermometer in some places in this city to-day stood at 104 degrees.
