WOMAN'S BODY FOUND

Remains, Which Were in the River at Mount Vernon, Brought to This City

In the discovery of the body of a woman, with apparently no marks of identification, floating in the Potomac River near the flats, a short distance north of Mount Vernon estate, the authorities of Fairfax county, have a mystery to solve. The discovery was made at 3:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon by J. H. Davis, an employe at Mount Vernon, while walking along the seawall east of the deer park.

Securing the body with a rope, Mr. Davis notified by telephone Ticket Agent, Wellington C. Crockett at the Royal street station this city, of the Washington-Virginia Railway, who in turn notified the police of Washington and Alexandria and Magistrate Harrie White, of Mount Vernon district, Fairfax county. By direction of Magistrate White the body was brought to Wheatley's undertaking establishment, in this city where a coroner's inquest will be held at 4 o'clock this afternoon.

The woman was apparently about 45 years of age, medium height and weight, with regular features and iron gray hair about 15 inches long. The body was dressed in a black serge coat suit and black satin shirt waist. The feet were incased in black leather low-quarter shoes bearing the stamp "Marshall Field, 7B."

There was no jewelry on the body, and if the clothing had contained the name of the maker it had been carefully removed. The woman's hair had become loosened, and there was no hat in evidence.

It is thought that the body probably had been in the water less than 24 hours, which leads to the conjecture that the woman, after destroying all marks of identification, jumped from a river steamer on Saturday night. There were no marks of violence on the body.

Members of the Washington police force came here today and took photographs of the dead woman. Neither they nor the Alexandria police have descriptions of missing women which in any way correspond to the unidentified female.

Forty-eight aeroplanes were shot down on the western battle front in Europe during the past 24 hours.

ROSH HASHANA NEAR

Jewish New Year Festival Begins Wednesday and Will Continue Two Days

"On the New Year all the inhabitants of the earth pass before Him, as sheep before a shepherd." These are the words of the ancient Jewish law book, the Mishna, with reference to the Jewish New Season, which will open on Wednesday night at Sundown.

The services of the two Jewish congregations in Alexandria, the Reformed and the Orthodox, will be particularly solemn. Among the Reformed Jews these will commence on Wednesday night, in the synagogue, at 7:30 o'clock, and continue over Thursday, with a special service again on that morning at 10 o'clock. The ceremonies will be conducted by Rabbi Solomon Landman, of the Hebrew Union Seminary, Cincinnati, assisted by Benedict Weil, president of the Synagogue, and Julius Wolf, the secretary.

Abe L. Cohen states that the members of Congregation Agudas Achin are to bring the Rev. Rabbi Lucks, of Washington, to conduct their services, which will also commence on Wednesday night and continue over both Thursday and Friday, in Sarpta Hall. During these High Holidays the places of business of all the Jewish merchants of the city will be closed.

The Jewish observances of this Holiday, as indeed of all others, are peculiarly solemn and inspiring. Prayers in poetry and prose, dwelling upon the theme of God's judgment of man, are recited and sung. The Ram's Horn, the "Shofar," summoning men to prayer and repentance is sounded in all synagogues. At the close of the service the worshippers greet each other with the words, "May you be written down for a good year."

The Jewish population of Alexandria now numbers about 250 men, women and children. They are a very important part of the city's business life in that a great majority of the heads of the families are in business for themselves and their property investments are very considerable.

Of this number approximately 95 are among those who adhere to the orthodox form of worship. Another important Jewish holiday will be The Day of Atonement or "Yom Kippur," which begins at sunset Friday, October 6 and ends at sunset of the following day. This is the most solemn of all the days in the Jewish Calendar. It is spent in fasting and prayer.

FINED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS.

SEVERAL MEN IN FIGHT

Police Find Drunken Woman and Four Neglected Children in House of Commerce Street

One of the cases before the Police Court this morning was that of bestiality upon the part of a woman and several men, some of the latter being married. The woman and four children—three girls and a boy—accompanied their mother. The eldest is fifteen years old. They huddled around the woman who had given them life unconscious, apparently, of the awful conditions with which they had been surrounded. Ida Saunders is the woman. She is a widow, apparently about 40 years old. She came to Alexandria from Quantico several months ago and took up abode at No. 328 Commerce street, which, it appeared from an investigation of the case, immediately became the retreat of several men, mostly young and married. The woman early Saturday night attended a religious meeting on a street corner, returning to her home about eleven o'clock. Some time after midnight a row started in her house and when the police entered she was found stretched upon the floor drunk, and it was impossible to arouse her. A fight had taken place between two men, and five of the inmates were taken in custody. Broken dishes and demolished furniture were scattered about the place.

William Simmons and J. E. Pettit, two of the party, left collateral for their appearance in the Police Court his morning. They failed to appear, however, and John Gillmartin, Lee Lyons and J. W. Sullivan, the others were brought into the dock.

The evidence was revolting, it being stated that the fight was precipitated when a man undertook to lead the fifteen-year-old girl astray, and was struck by one of the men in the house at the time.

Justice Caton, after hearing all the evidence, sent the woman to the workhouse and ordered the children to be turned over to the authorities of the Children's Home.

The case against the men was continued until tomorrow, when the men who left collateral will be arraigned together with another of the party who could not be found Saturday night or yesterday.
