BRITISH TRAMP SUNK

Bay Liner "City of Norfolk" Badly Damaged but There is No Loss of Life.

Norfolk, Oct. 7.—In a collision in the inner harbor shortly before 8 o'clock last night, the British tramp steamer Hawkhead, said to have been at anchor, was sunk, and the Bay liner City of Norfolk, of the Chesapeake Steamship Company's line, was badly damaged. There was no loss of life and, so far as can be learned, no one seriously injured.

The accident was due to a heavy fog hanging over the harbor. The city of Norfolk, was outward-bound, and carried in the neighborhood of 100 passengers. The majority were at supper, when the crash came. Great excitement prevailed for a few minutes, but was quickly quieted by the officers on the liner.

Fearing that the damage to the steamer was greater than could be ascertained, the passengers on the City of Norfolk were immediately transferred to the Old Dominion River steamer Pocahontas, where they remained only a few minutes, when the majority were transferred to an out-going Old Bay Line steamer for the continuation of the voyage up the bay. About fifteen of the passengers elected to return to Norfolk.

The Hawkhead sank about fifteen minutes after the collision. She is in about thirty feet of water. She sank stern first, and the vessel's bow is still visible from the piers. The small boats from the City of Norfolk, the Pocahontas and other harbor boats in the vicinity rescued all on board the tramp.

The bow of the City of Norfolk was crushed for ten feet, but the bulkheads held well, and she remained afloat. She is declared to be in no danger, although it will be necessary to send her to the shipyard. The Norfolk returned to her pier with the assistance of the company's tugs, rushed to the scene.

Except the statement that the harbor was enveloped in fog, officials have not given any cause for the collision.

HORRIBLE DEATH.

Venomous Snakes Snap at Face of Man who Had Escaped From Sheriff.

Denver, Oct. 6.—A horrible death, alone at night in a vast, trackless swamp, where he gradually sank from sight into the foul green mire, while venomous snakes snapped at his face, is the fate of Samuel D. Barry, former resident of Golden, who escaped from a Colorado Sheriff, Sunday, when being brought back from New Orleans to stand trial in Golden on charges of horse stealing. Barry, 25 years old, leaped through the open window of a Santa Fe train near Guthrie, Okla., when the express was making 50 miles an hour and passing a swamp 40 miles square. It was nearly 9 o'clock at night, and dark.

The train was stopped and a search begun. Traces of blood were followed from where Barry landed to the edge of the swamp, a few yards away. Out in the dismal, murky swamp moans and cries could be faintly heard, but these suddenly ceased. By the aid of their lanterns they could see hundreds of the writhing, wriggling, venomous reptiles which infest the morass.

Residents of the region say there is no doubt Barry plunged headlong into the black swamp to escape, and gradually sank below the surface of the treacherous bog within a few minutes. They also state that the reptiles would have caused his death in a few minutes.

VIRGINIA FORTUNATE

Because of Stringent Quarantine Under State Health Officer Smith Infantile Paralysis is kept down.

Following a conference in Richmond recently between State Health Commissioner Williams and Dr. W. M. Smith, of Alexandria, president of the State Board of Health, an order was entered by Commissioner Williams in the following language: "Careful analysis of complete returns for infantile paralysis showing that 97 per cent of cases in Virginia are under 12 years, State quarantine against infantile paralysis is lowered to that age after 12:01 A. M., October 8. Special cases will be considered on their merits. Thus far Virginia has had less paralysis than any State on the Atlantic seaboard. We attribute this to quarantine. If the disease continues to spread in Massachusetts and Maryland, Virginia may be compelled to quarantine children under twelve from these States."

Under the quarantine order entered by the State board on August 26, Virginia was unconditionally closed to children under 16 years coming from New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. The only exception allowed was in the case of Virginia children returning to their homes, who, it was provided, had to be quarantined for two weeks after their return.

The quarantine regulation remains as it was before, with two important changes. Instead of sixteen, twelve years is fixed as the age under which children from the proscribed States will be barred, and a modification leaves room for a suspension of even this limitation in special cases, to be considered on their merits. The new order goes into effect to-morrow night, one minute after midnight.

Alexandria policeman are stationed daily in Rosemont and Washington street extended watching automobiles entering this city, and coming from proscribed States are stopped and investigations made. Cases of infantile paralysis exist in our city.

The age limit of the patients during this three-month period was 15. More than 98 per cent were under 14 years old and 97.4 per cent were under 11. Children under 10 years old formed 96.2 per cent of the total number of cases; under nine years, 92.5 per cent; under eight, 89.9 per cent; under seven, 87.4 per cent; under six, 82.3 per cent; under five, 77.3 per cent; under four, 64.7 per cent; under three, 49.5 per cent; under two, 36.9 per cent, and under one year 21.5 per cent.
