

VIRGINIA NEWS

Paragaphs Picked Up Here and There Throughout the State.

Considerable excitement was aroused at the University of Virginia yesterday afternoon by the discovery of an underground passageway, which started in proximity to the room occupied by Edgar Allan Poe, 13 West Range, and extended nearly 200 yards. The passageway is arched with brick through its entire length and a person nearly five feet tall can walk through it without stooping. It is similar to the one at Monticello, through which Thomas Jefferson is supposed to have made his escape from General Tarleton, of the British Army. As a matter of fact the tunnel at Monticello was for sewer purposes, and doubtless the mysterious subterranean passage discovered yesterday at the university was constructed for the same use, although the floor is of natural dirt.

Dr. George Tucker Harrison, 81 years old, a surgeon in the Confederate Army and now a physician at the University of Virginia, has gone to New York city, where he will wed this week a Mrs. Seymour, a widow. Dr. Harrison is a son of the late Dr. Gessner Harrison, for years professor of ancient languages at the University of Virginia.

Massanutten Academy has suspended classes until January 1, owing to an epidemic of typhoid fever caused by the use of insanitary milk. Richard Messer, State Sanitary Engineer, has been in Woodstock for a week and reported the sanitary conditions at the academy satisfactory and the water supply pure. Two dairies which supply milk for the families affected have been ordered to discontinue. Twelve cases have been reported.

Patrolman Peyton M. Stewart arrested a white man at the Petersburg station of the Seaboard Air Line Railway yesterday who had brought with him in a trunk enough liquor to start a blind tiger. The man arrived here Saturday night from Baltimore. The weight of his trunk and the odor of whiskey escaping from it attracted the attention of the officer and when the stranger failed to call for it immediately it was opened by the authorities and found to contain 122 half pints of whisky. The stranger was placed under arrest.

Peyton, seven year old son of Peyton Fortune, was run down by an automobile yesterday in Fairview Heights, near Lynchburg, and is seriously if not fatally injured.

Leonard Karnes, of Covington was killed accidentally yesterday morning near White Sulphur Springs, while riding on a freight train.

Robert Faulconer, thirteen-year-old son of A. L. Faulconer, who was injured in a fall several days ago, in which he sustained a fractured skull, died yesterday morning at St. Andrew's Hospital, Lynchburg.

Edgar Eugene Christie, twelve-year-old son of Councilman and Mrs. E. E. Christie, of Newport News was kicked and almost instantly killed by a horse while playing in a vacant field near his home Saturday afternoon.

MINISTERS MUST LEAVE.

Commander of Allied Fleet so Informs Representatives of Central Alliance.

London, Nov. 21.—An Athens dispatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company, says: The German Austro-Hungarian, Bulgarian and Turkish ministers to Greece, have been informed by Vice Admiral Du Fournet, commander of the allied fleet, that they must depart from Greece by Wednesday.

Vice Admiral du Fournet notified the Ministers that they must go aboard a steamer which has been placed at their disposal; otherwise they will be taken forcibly.

The American legation has undertaken the protection of the Austrians, Turks and Bulgars in Greece, while the Spanish legation will take charge of German interests.

A Reuter dispatch from Athens, dated Sunday, says that the situation in Greece is of the gravest importance.

"The nature of the allied demands formulated Saturday are concealed, but it is inferred that they took the form of an ultimatum, expiring today."

The Daily Mail's Athens correspondent says:

"The immediate cause of the expulsion of the Ministers was the discovery that the German naval attaché, Baron von Senarclens Grancy, was engaged in espionage."

Athens, Nov. 21.—A royal decree issued today accepts the resignation of the officers of the Greek army, who desire to join the provisional government at Saloniki and orders their liberation from Syzro prison, where they have been confined on charges of desertion from the Greek army.

The Greek government was expected to proclaim the formation of a neutral zone between two sectors of the country. The French will guard the zone, and also administer towns in it.


