NEWS OF THE DAY.

The stamina of the Germans working in factory towns along the Rhine is growing weaker daily, due to allied bombardments, food conditions and the long-delayed victory. So say travelers just returning to Amsterdam from Cologne and other Rhine towns. The Germans are seizing the rolling stock and equipment of many trolley lines in occupied Belgium. The rails are taken up and shipped to Germany, regardless of the protests of the civilians.

The British destroyed Marne has sunk a German submarine, says an official statement by the British admiralty. The admiralty statement follows: "The same day that the German troops were driven back of the Marne by the allied armies a German submarine was sunk by the British torpedo boat destroyer Marne." Appropriations made by the two sessions of the War Congress have reached almost the \$50,000,000,000 mark. The amount appropriated by the first session, following the declaration of war, was \$18,879,177,014.96. The total amount thus far appropriated by the present session, including authorizations for contracts which have to be met by appropriations at a later time, is \$20,791,241,773.67. This does not include two bills passed by the House but not acted upon by the Senate, appropriating \$21,712,285. The grand total of these appropriations is \$48,692,131,071.65.

The entire property of the former Emperor, his wife and his mother, as well as all other members of the imperial house, has been forfeited to the Russian republic, according to a Moscow message received in Amsterdam. This will include deposits in foreign banks to the credit of the members of the imperial family. A decree to this effect was issued by the Bolshevik government on July 17. In reporting the death of the former Emperor the Moscow Bledneta says: "By order of the revolutionary council of the people, the bloody Czar has happily died. Live the red terror."

Federal authorities have uncovered a vast German plot involving 300,000 German reservists to start an armed invasion of Canada with 150,000 men to prevent that country's sending more troops to Europe and to send an army of 150,000 reservists to Mexico to foment war between Mexico and the United States. The plot was revealed through the arrest in New York last Tuesday of Dr. Friederich August Richard von Strensch, a relative of the Kaiser and the discovery among his papers of letters from an American woman which spoke frankly of the plans.

The indictment against the Kaiser and his six unwounded sons as perpetrators of a "family war" has subscribers within Germany. Here is what the Socialist Cohn said about it in the Reichstag, according to Berlin papers: "The so-called 'new states' which we have created in Russia are

fertilized by the bones of their best sons, murdered by German soldiers who were misused for the purpose. The whole war has been purely a family affair of the Hohenzollerns! The consequences will be that Europe will be a continent of beggars!"

The police and espionage system in Germany is growing worse than ever. No one can make a remark against the Kaiser or the government without having someone at his back threatening him. When the Kaiser visited

the Aisne front recently a man in a cafe remarked, "Oh, that ass! He always arrives on the scene when the danger is over!" One of the men sitting next to him immediately notified the police.

General William McComb, one of the few surviving general officers of the Confederate army, died Sunday night at the home of his daughter, Mrs. A. W. Puryear, in Gordonsville, after an illness of four weeks. He was in the ninetieth year of his age. General McComb was a native of Pennsylvania.

## Fresh Beef Travels on a Rapid Schedule

Fresh beef for domestic markets goes from stockyards to retail stores within a period of about two weeks. Although chilled, this meat is not frozen; hence it cannot be stored for a rise in price.

A steer is dressed usually within twenty-four hours after purchase by the packer. The beef is held in a cooler at the packing house, at a temperature a little above freezing, for about three days.

It is then loaded into a refrigerator car, where a similar temperature is maintained, and is in transit to market on an average of about six days.

Upon arrival at the branch distributing house, it is unloaded into a "cooler", and placed on sale.

Swift & Company requires all beef to be sold during the week of arrival, and the average of sales is within five days.

Any delay along the above journey means deterioration in the meat and loss to the packer.
