NEWS OF THE DAY.

The Senate Judiciary Committee yesterday reported the Red Flag bill, which heavily penalizes seditious anarchist speeches and activities.

The Amir of Afghanistan has been assassinated, it is announced in official dispatches received yesterday in London.

The whole Atlantic Coast is now regarded by navigation experts as absolutely safe for sea traffic which was slightly nervous during the summer of 1918 because of the fact that German submarines had been busy sowing mines specially in the North Atlantic.

Gen. Bennet H. Young, former commander in chief of the United Confederate Veterans, is dead at Louisville, Ky., following a brief illness. Gen. Young won fame as a cavalry leader during the civil war, serving with Morgan, Stuart and Mosby.

While 2,000 were dancing around them, Anthony De Andria, 24, and Anthony Neapolitana, 26, squared off in the center of the Empire Dance Hall floor in New York early yesterday and shot each other to death. Both were suitors for the hand of a pretty Italian girl. Each fired one shot. De Andria being hit in the head, and Neapolitana in the abdomen.

The entire garrison of Munich has joined the Spartacists, according to latest word from the revolt-swept Bavarian capital. The "Reds" have arrested many prominent men, including all majority Socialist ministers. The provisional government of Bavaria is composed of the ministers, mostly minority Socialists. The authorities of Munich have seized a list containing many scheduled assassinations including plots for the murder of twenty royal bastards.


Eckington was isolated from Washington last night while a \$200,000 fire, the first three alarm fire in five years, which destroyed twelve Washington Railway and Electric Company cars, raged for two hours. Flames from the fire imprisoned walls of the Eckington car barn were the first alarm nearby residents had of their danger. Hundreds of sleeping residents fifty feet away were endangered but quick action of the fire department prevented but minor damage to the residences.

VIRGINIA NEWS

The Senate yesterday passed a bill providing for transfer of Fisherman's Island from the Treasury Department to the War Department for fortification.

Charles N. Smith, a well known farmer of Madison county, shot himself last week at his home, dying instantly. Loading his gun, he went out behind the icehouse, placed the muzzle of the gun against his heart and pulled the trigger. He was 70 years of age.

A ponderous motor truck and engine bought recently by the Friendship Fire Company at a cost of \$9,000, was badly damaged while responding to an alarm of fire in Winchester, when the driver lost control, the machine plunging into a tree. The front part of the truck was demolished.

RUSSIAN MONEY

Berlin, Feb. 25.—Many prominent refugees from Russia paint fantastic pictures in which comedy mixes with tragedy. A high Russian officer who escaped said to me yesterday: "Russian money, which is the keynote of the Bolsheviks power, is being printed in Berlin. Bolshevik soldiers are paid \$20 an hour during fighting. Trotsky's private guards get \$12,500 a month each.

"The Bolsheviks away now numbers 1,000,000 including 25,000 well trained soldiers. I am convinced if the allies sent 50,000 volunteers, hundreds of thousands of Russians would join to overcome the Bolsheviks.

"The allies should install their own government in Russia and exploit the natural resources, or Germany will. Even if Bolshevism is crushed, Russia will be unable for at least ten years to govern herself. The political parties continue fighting. The situation will soon be worse than the Bolsheviks."
