BOOTLEGGERS KILLED
 Gun Battle in Mountain of Wise County—Sheriff Leads Raid, Capturing Twenty-One
 Prohibition headquarters in Richmond received a report from inspectors working near Birchfield, Wise county, yesterday, telling of the killing of an unidentified man, supposedly a bootlegger, in a shooting affair near there in which two prohibition inspectors were wounded.
 After the shooting, which occurred Monday, Federal officers and citizens, led by Sheriff Litton, of Wise County, made a raid in which twenty-one arrests were made. Nine of the men were taken to Roanoke to stand trial before the United States District Court. The two prohibition inspectors wounded by the alleged bootleggers and moonshiners were B. H. Gardner, who was only slightly wounded, and Grady Stultz, who received a bullet through the shoulder.

STRIKE NEARS CLIMAX

Telegraphers To Abide by Decision of Labor Officials
 Chicago, June 18.—The climax in the nation wide strike of commercial telegraphers will probably be reached within 24 hours, union leaders declared last night after a conference at general strike headquarters here.
 A telegram was sent to Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, stating that the strikers would abide by decisions reached at conferences to be held by Mr. Gompers and other federation officers and representatives of the telegraphers' union. At one of these conferences the question of placing the strike situation before President Wilson in a cablegram will be discussed.

BOMB BLAST IN CHICAGO

Explosion Believed Sequel For Warning to Aust Negro Tenants
 Chicago, June 18.—A bomb was exploded in the exclusive residence district of the south side known as the Gold Coast Monday night, breaking windows for blocks around and doing some minor damage to property.
 The bomb was exploded near the residence of William B. Austin, broker, and is believed to be the sequel to the telephone warning to Mr. Austin to get rid of negro tenants in properties he owns on the south side.
 In that section repeated bomb explosions have occurred in buildings occupied by negroes.

AIR SERVICES TO ICELAND

Regular Line to be Established With the United States
 Official advice to Washington, though, are that Iceland intends to establish a regular air service between Rekkjavik, its capital, and the Eastern ports of the United States.
 P. A. Clafson, consul at Reykjavik, is quoted as saying that two hydroplanes, with sufficient power to accomplish a trans-Atlantic flight, are already in commission and that a large airplane corporation has been formed to bring about regular aerial voyages between Iceland and the United States.
