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HELD FOR MAN'S DEATH Victim Dies From Result of Blow Administered in Fight Philadelphia, June 21.—James L. Greenfield, 35 years old, of 1521 Fairmont avenue, died yesterday in St. Joseph's Hospital from injuries received Wednesday in a fight at Sixteenth street and Fairmont avenue. David McGinnis, of Sixteenth street near Fairmont avenue, who is alleged to have struck Greenfield, was held without bail by Magistrate McCreary, yesterday in the Central police station, pending the action of the Coroner. "I did it in self-defense," McGinnis told the police. "He owed me fifty dollars, and when we had an argument he struck me. I returned the blow, as any other person would."

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STORM IN PENNSYLVANIA Growing Crops Damaged; Electric Service Tied up Bloomsburg, Pa., June 21.—The most severe thunder and hail storm Columbia county has ever experienced in years did many thousands of dollars of damage to growing crops yesterday, while hundreds of panes of glass were knocked out of Bloomsburg greenhouse. The county's electrical service was tied up the greater part of the day, with many county industries dependent upon electric power compelled to close down for the day. Hail as large as walnuts fell at Mainville. The house of Ray Watts was struck by lightning, and Mrs. Watts was rendered unconscious for a half hour. The house of Harry Christian, of Berwick, was struck, but the only damage done was the tearing of a bed to pieces otherwise the exterior and interior were untouched.

CLAIM R-34 CIRCLED OVER CITY OF BERLIN London, June 21.—The R-34 returned Thursday afternoon from what is semi-officially described as "an interesting mission, successfully accomplished." Though the Admiralty is silent, the story will not down that the big dirigible circled over Berlin yesterday afternoon. It is admitted that she touched Baltic ports on her "interesting mission." Report also has it she penetrated as far east as Danzig. No official statement, whatever, has been issued to this cable, the dirigible's future movements depend entirely on whether peace is signed. If it is signed, she will depart for New York as soon as her landing place on Hazelhurst Field is thoroughly prepared.

BRITISH TORPEDO RUSSIAN CRUISER Warship Sunk off Kronstadt—Trotzky Directing Defense of Petrograd London, June 21.—The Russian cruiser Oleg was sunk on Wednesday by a British submarine, it is announced in a Russian wireless dispatch received yesterday. The sinking occurred near the Tolbuchen Lighthouse. The Oleg was a vessel of 6,770 tons. MEMO: The object of this suit is to ascertain the heirs of Mary A.
