VIRGINIA NEWS

Twenty-five families attended the seventh annual meeting of the Monticello Association, composed of descendants of Thomas Jefferson, at the University of Virginia yesterday. Thomas Jefferson Kean, chief of the ambulance service during the war, presided. The Jefferson family paid tribute to Capt. George Wayne Anderson, of Richmond and Capt. Hamilton Coolidge of Brookline, Mass., who lost their lives in the war.

Assaulted and robbed near Union Station, Washington, while en route to Cambridge, Mass., to be married, Robert Byron Whitman, war veteran, wandered penniless about the nation's capital for several days trying to borrow funds to return home. He made his way to Baltimore and secured from his brother, Roy W. Whitman, of that city, sufficient money for transportation back to Virginia. He returned to Richmond yesterday. According to his story he was robbed of \$1,000, representing his savings since he was mustered out of service. He said three footpads attacked him, knocking him almost senseless. The wedding was set for last Wednesday. Whitman made his money at the Newport News Shipyard. He says that he will return there in order to recoup his finances before again considering matrimony.

To obtain speedy passage to England, the Rev. J. Compson, D. D., rector of the Grace Protestant Church, of Newport News, signed as a member of the crew of the British freighter Middleham Castle. The determination of the minister to reach his home in England as quickly as possible, even if he had to work his way over, was the result of the sudden death of his wife and consequent desire to reach his English home quickly so as to take care of his motherless son. He signed up as a cook and now is on his way. While addressing the congregation of the Grace Protestant Episcopal Church on a recent Sunday morning a premonition of her death came to him. To the great surprise of the congregation, the rector stopped speaking, looked about him in a daze, and then announced that he could not go on

with the sermon. That afternoon Dr. Compson received a cablegram from England announcing the death of his wife.

With the Monroe Doctrine as his subject, Randolph Harrison, of Lynchburg, president of the Virginia State Bar Association, delivered the annual address yesterday before more than 200 members of the auditorium of the Jefferson Hotel. He declared the principles underlying the doctrine were passing through a crisis at this time. The issue, he said, sharply raised, is whether the Monroe Doctrine is to lose its identity as an American policy and be swallowed up in a world wide right of self determination for all nations, as President Wilson suggests, or is to be maintained in its integrity as the fundamental principle of our foreign policy.

Five of eleven prisoners in the Rockingham County jail at Harrisonburg made their escape Monday while the prison was being fumigated, following the lifting of the smallpox quarantine. Three were captured within half an hour and the others surrendered after first telephoning the sheriff that they were willing to return. Six prisoners, including one charged with murder, made no effort to follow the lead of those who escaped.

HUNS MAY NOT ATTEND

Berlin Announces Refusal to Send Delegates if French Hold Hessian Cities

Berlin, May 12.—Germany has reduced the number of troops in the neutral zone to the prescribed limit and now will demand the immediate evacuation of Frankfurt and other Hessian points. Minister of Defense Gessler declared in an interview last night. He said the Berlin government desires to have the issue cleared before the Spa conference.

It was officially announced last night the German government will not send delegates to Spa while the French occupation of Frankfurt and other Hessian towns continued.

A semi-official announcement said the entire German military air force had been disbanded.


