City of Richmond, August 9th, 1920.
WHEREAS, amended and supplemental petitions in the above entitled proceedings have this day been filed by the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, the Southern Railway Company, and other railroad carriers on behalf of themselves and all other steam railroads operating in Virginia, asking authority to make the following increases in intrastate freight rates and charges, passenger fares and charges, baggage rates, etc., in Virginia to correspond with similar increases authorized and ordered by the Interstate Commerce Commission on interstate rates, fares and charges under its decision in Docket Ex Parte 74:

1st. All passenger fares and charges to be increased twenty per cent (20) The term "passenger fares" to be considered to include standard, local or interline fares; excursion, convention and other fares for special occasions; commutation and other multiple forms of tickets; extra fares on limited trains; club car charges.
2nd. Excess baggage rates to be increased twenty per cent (20 per cent). Provided that where stated as a percentage of or dependent upon passenger fares the increase in the latter will automatically effect the increase in the excess baggage charges.

3rd. To impose a surcharge upon passengers in sleeping and parlor cars, the same to be made fifty per cent (50 per cent) of the charge for space in such cars, such surcharge to be collected in connection with the charge for space and to accrue to the rail carrier.

4th. All rates on milk and cream carried in passenger service, to be increased twenty per cent (20 per cent).

5th. All freight transportation rates and charges, switching charges, charges for transit, weighing, diversion, reconsignment, lighterage, floatage and storage (not including track storage) and transfer to be increased forty per cent (40 per cent.), that being the increase authorized in interstate freight rates and charges by the Interstate Commerce Commission in Ex Parte 74 within Official Classification territory, which territory, in said petitions, is said to embrace practically the whole of the State of Virginia. If authority to include the whole of the State of Virginia in the Eastern group taking an advance of forty per cent (40 per cent) in all freight rates and charges be not granted them, as an alternative the amended and supplemental petitions of the carriers seek authority to increase all intrastate freight transportation rates, switching and other freight charges above enumerated, to the extent of forty per cent (40 per cent) within that part of the State of Virginia lying on and north of the line of the Norfolk and Western Railway Company from Norfolk through Petersburg, Lynchburg and Roanoke to Bristol, including all branches of the Norfolk and Western Railway Company in Virginia between Norfolk and Bristol, and including also the line of the Virginia Railway lying south thereof; and in that portion of the State of Virginia lying south of the line of the Norfolk and Western from Norfolk through Petersburg, Lynchburg and Roanoke to Bristol, but excluding the line of the Virginia Railway and the above mentioned branches of the Norfolk and Western Railway Company in Virginia, all freight transportation rates and switching and

other charges above mentioned to be increased twenty-five (25 per cent); while joint and single line through rates between points north and south of the said dividing line are to be increased thirty-three and one-third (33 1-3 per cent) per cent.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that said original petitions and the amended and supplemental petitions, upon motion of the petitioners be, and the same are, hereby consolidated and are directed to be heard together and that said petitions and amended and supplemental petitions be sent down for hearing on Monday, the sixteenth day of August, 1920, at ten o'clock A. M., in the court room of the State Corporation Commission in the city of Richmond, Virginia, at which time the commission will proceed to consider and dispose of and determine upon the propriety of granting the advance in rates, fares and charges, both freight and passenger, prayed for in said amended and supplemental petitions, and to consider any additions or changes therein as may be pertinent and proper, and will at that time and place hear any objections which may be urged by any person in interest to the allowance of the increases proposed, or to the entry of an order authorizing the advance in rates requested in said amended and supplemental petitions.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that applicants shall cause to be published a copy of this order twice in newspapers of general circulation published in the following cities: Richmond, Roanoke, Lynchburg, Norfolk, Bristol, Staunton, Charlottesville, Danville, Alexandria and Petersburg. A copy.
