

The Old Dominion

Richmond—The city is swarming with Methodist preachers this evening, and a good many of the laity, male and female, are in the throng. Hotels are full and many private homes are entertaining guests in connection with the annual session of the Virginia Conference, which meets tomorrow morning.

Richmond—Because of an epidemic of smallpox at Montross and vicinity, it is regarded here as practically a foregone conclusion that the Circuit Court of Westmoreland County will not convene October 24, as scheduled. At any rate, even if the grand jury gets down to work on that day, there is but little if any probability that the court will undertake to proceed with the trials of Roger D. Eastlake and Miss Sarah Knox, charged jointly with the recent murder of Eastlake's pretty young wife at Colonial Beach in that county. Latest reports from Westmoreland are to the effect that practically the entire Montross neighborhood is under quarantine and the quarantine is likely to be extended to other sections of the county. Eastlake and Miss Knox are still being held in the Richmond city jail to which they were removed ten days ago.

Roanoke—J. H. B. Peary of Richmond, was chosen state councillor for

the ensuing year at the 37th annual convention of the Junior Order United American Mechanics which terminated its session in this city yesterday and will meet next year in Newport News. J. B. Bliz, of Norfolk, was chosen state vice councillor; Thomas B. Ivey, Petersburg, state secretary; A. L. Bradley, of Richmond, state treasurer, and Fred Trent, Lynchburg, state council conductor. These officers were elected without opposition.

Danville—Discussion with a local leader today of the threatened railway strike revealed the fact that the Southern and its subsidiary lines are among the first group to walk out and that approximately 250 men will be affected here. He declared that 90 per cent of the Danville union men had voted to strike, also that they would probably have accepted the 12 per cent wage reduction without taking any action. It was the threat of a further cut

which caused the strike vote to be taken.

Richmond—Members of the governor's advisory board assembled to consider the state budget were staggered yesterday afternoon when a tabulation showed that requests for appropriations for the next biennial period were \$13,000,000 in excess of estimated revenues for that period. Other requests are coming in and these will greatly swell the total.
