Congress.

In the Senate, on the 18th, Mr. Edmunds introduced a bill to repeal the act of June 5th, 1865, admitting Georgia to representation in Congress.

Mr. Sumner's resolution expressing sympathy with the people of Spain was passed by a vote of forty-one yeas to five nays.

In the House Mr. Schofield introduced a bill giving to the officers in the military and naval service who were commissioned but not mustered, pay according to the rank of commission, referred to committee on military affairs.

Mr. Boutwell from the reconstruction committee reported back the Senate amendments relieving from political disabilities a certain number of elected officials in South Carolina and other States.

Cable Specials.—Constantinople dated of December 18th, state that the Turkish Admiral, Hobar Pasha, followed the Greek steamer, E. R. Osie, into the harbor of Syria, and sunk her, but the report lacks confirmation.

The commander of the French war ship, Faubin, requested the Turkish Admiral not to adopt any coercive measure until he heard from Commodore Antea. This the Admiral agreed to do and now awaits orders.

CADIZ, 18th. Notwithstanding the proclamation of clemency recently issued to the leaders in the late insurrection, several of the prominent ones have been imprisoned here.

About 75 have been arrested, and submitted to trial by Court Martial. Business has resumed its natural sway, and the people are returning to their homes. Gen. Dulce sailed with his fleet for Cuba to-day.

CONSTANTINOPLE, 18th. The news is confirmed that the ultimatum of the Sultan has been rejected by Greece.

NEW YORK, Dec. 19th. Additional particulars from Little Rock, Arkansas, of to-day's dates, confirm the former reports of outrages perpetrated by the militia, and establish the fact that no resistance was ever offered to the civil authorities.

Representatives of Northern Mercantile Houses are all leaving the State, anticipating further trouble.

Hon. Schuyler Colfax Vice President elect, arrived in Philadelphia, tonight, and this afternoon will dine at the Union League House. He will proceed to New York and Massachusetts, returning to Washington before New Year's.
