

A PRISTESS OF ANARCHY.

Emma Goldman, from whom Czolgoz says he received the impulse to murder the President, is about 35 years old, the daughter of a Russian tailor.

She came to this country seventeen years ago and married a man named Grunbaum, with whom she lived in Rochester, N. Y. She deserted him after a year and a half.

Assuming the name of Goldman, she joined an anarchistic group known as the Pioneers of Liberty. Her language was so violent that they expelled her.

Alexander Berkman, who travels around the country with her, shot Henry C. Frick at the Carnegie works. Both she and Berkman then joined the extreme wing of the anarchists.

She got into trouble for the first time when she made an incendiary address at a meeting of the unemployed at Union Square, New York, on August 21, 1893.
