MINNESOTA'S CENSUS.

Interesting Figures Taken From the Final Census Returns.

We give below some interesting results of the 1900 U. S. census for Minnesota just completed.

The detailed figures for Mower county, by townships and villages, are as follows:

Totals..... 22,335 18,019

The population of Minnesota is 1,751,894, an increase since 1890 of 449,568, or 34.5 per cent.

The population in 1880 was 780,773, an increase of 521,053, or 66.7 per cent from 1880 to 1890.
