The County Board of the County of Mower, State of Minnesota, met in special session at the office of the County Auditor of said County in the City of Austin, at 3 o'clock P. M., on Tuesday the 20th day of May, A. D., 1913, pursuant to call.

Members present, C. L. Schwartz, F. E. Hambrecht, J. R. Johnson and Wm. Christie.

On motion duly seconded and carried County Board adjourned to 8 o'clock A. M., May 21st, 1913.

8:00 o'clock A. M., May 21st, 1913. County Board met pursuant to adjournment. Members present, C. L. Schwartz, W. H. Goodsell, F. E. Hambrecht, J. R. Johnson and Wm. Christie.

On motion duly seconded and carried the following resolution was adopted, viz:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF MOWER COUNTY, MINNESOTA, That pursuant to chapter 376 of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1913 there be and hereby is appropriated and set aside out of the general revenue fund of said county the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) available for the fiscal year ending July 31st, 1914, for the maintenance support and expenses of a County Agricultural Agent; said sum of money appropriated to be subject to the order of the Dean of the Department of Agriculture of the University of Minnesota, and to be paid upon such order, and only upon such order, for the salary of said agricultural agent and such further employees as may be employed by him within the appropriations available and other expenses incident to the work of said agent.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That it is the determination, intention and purpose of the County Board of Mower County, Minnesota, that a like sum of money will be appropriated during the following year to be available for the fiscal year ending July 31st, 1915, for the purposes above mentioned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in case the County of Mower receives aid from the state of Minnesota for the maintenance and expenses of a County Agricultural Agent, the County Board of Mower County, Minnesota, agrees to employ an Agricultural Agent approved by the Dean of the Department of Agriculture of the University of Minnesota, and who will meet the requirements of the United States Department of Agriculture.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Auditor of Mower County, Minnesota, be and he is hereby directed to immediately mail a copy of this resolution to the Dean of the Department of Agriculture of the University of Minnesota.
