CHILD TRAINING

Rev. A. Cressey Makes a Plea for the Better Training of Children by Parents.

Austin, Minn., Jan. 21, 1914.
EDITOR MOWER COUNTY TRANSCRIPT

I've just been reading "Farmer Ben's" article of above date and I agree with him that the boys and girls of the present generation need more home training in good manners, and how to treat the people that are advancing in age, and to render all possible help to the afflicted ones and in no way make fun of their afflictions and deficiencies and especially to obey their parents in all lawful commands, for this is the first commandment with promise of God's blessing upon them. And these are the kind of young people that are called for in all lines of business today and will be all through the tomorrows. In my opinion it is the duty of every father and mother to train their children to some useful occupations, the father the sons, and the mothers their daughters to sew, and mend, and knit, and cook, and there is more need of this than training them for school teachers. I have known teachers when the proposition came for to enter the married relations, who did not know how to cook and keep house properly. One of these was a graduate of Hamline University and the daughter of a Presiding Elder; but she had sense enough not to accept the offer until she had learned the art of cooking, then, the learned transaction was done, she became her Lord's, and he was hers, and for a good number of years they have been enjoying each other's society on California's golden sands.

Another case of an excellent school teacher of the Methodist Episcopal church on one of my long ago charges whose heart and affections were sought and won by the richest farmer's son on the charge, and this writer had the privilege of saying what God hath joined together let no man put asunder. The knot was tied, which Webster says is "to unite closely," which in this case continues to this day, untied. Some time ago I visited the old charge and the bride of years ago ventured to place a kiss upon the pastor's cheek for the good work he did in years gone by. But this young teacher did not want to learn the art of cooking but closed the bargain and contract. His father gave him a 160 acre farm and of course the pastor and wife were shortly invited to spend the day and partake of the hospitality at their table, but an older sister was called in to help prepare the dinner, she having entered the list a little earlier and had learned the art of cooking and teaching also. Since then I have advised all our people to teach in due time the girls the art of cooking for one landlady going home from church with me on another charge said, I think, "the way to reach a man's heart is through his stomach." So I would say to all the young women of the community that are looking to enter the matrimonial market, get all the learning you can, and especially the art of good cooking, and neat house-keeping, and especially the art of making the bed fit to lie down upon, not leaving bunches of feathers hard to lie upon. Aim to be the best housekeeper in every department in the community where you may reside. And on the other side of the house, make your wives as little extra trouble as possible, give them the best materials to work with and on, that your income will allow, not going in debt without a probability of paying for them. Then married life will be a blessing to all, and a curse to none. Husbands love your wives, and generally this love will be returned, and family life will become a little heaven to go to heaven in. This has been the aim and experience for 47 1/2 years with one of the best women the Lord ever made, and Methodists are generally good on experience.

Farmer Ben has another good thing about the penny and the nickels and if the rising generation would put this into practice it would be a great help in laying a foundation for the business relations of every day life. And in regard to Farmer Ben's picture if he would throw away his bashfulness his readers would be able to tell whether he practices what he preaches. It is easier to say than to do. Happy are we if we know these things and do them. This was the teaching of one greater than Uncle Ben, a Carpenter's son of Nazareth, nearly 1900 years ago.
