Sometimes I hear it charged by thoughtless farmers that the railroads are largely responsible for the existing misfortunes of farm life, and that the freighting of grain and similar products from the immense and fertile farms bordering along railroad lines at low rates, has killed the business of farmers who own smaller and less productive farms, and shut them out of competition.

REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION. A Republican Convention for the State of Minnesota, will be held on Thursday, the Fifth day of May, 1892, in Market Hall, in the City of St. Paul, at eleven o'clock a. m., for the purpose of electing four delegates at large, and four alternates at large, to the National Republican Convention, to be held in Minneapolis, June Seventh, 1892, and to place in nomination nine presidential electors, and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the convention.

The following resolutions were unanimously adopted by the State committee: Resolved that each county be entitled to one delegate for each five hundred votes cast for the Republican candidate for president in 1888, and one delegate for fraction thereof over one hundred.
