Mr. Ray Humiston, superintendent of the Congregational Sabbath school of Worthington, gave notice that himself and others of their C. E. S. would come out on Sunday, July 17, at 3 o'clock to reorganize the Sabbath school near Mr. Whitney's residence.

Our meaning as to the sort of calamity that threatens our future will be better understood after the careful study of the following utterance of a Chicago labor union: "It solved, that we affirm that labor creates all wealth; that wealth belongs to its producers, and that therefore the mills and other property in the possession of the Carnegie company is the rightful property of the workmen of Pennsylvania who produced it."

This is very much as if they had declared that after a man has furnished the material for a building, and paid laborers and mechanics for constructing it, that the structure and the land on which it stood, belonged to the workmen who had built it. Such doctrine controlled the murderous element of the terrible French Revolution.

Then we have the doctrine practically asserted that manufacturing establishments can only be run on terms dictated by combinations of the operatives. The day will be an evil one when combines of any sort shall be permitted to interfere with or control the property of other men.

The riot is justified by some because the Pinkerton forces were employed to protect the Carnegie property. But if the State troops had been called upon at first would there not have been the same outcry against them? The Pinkertons were simply private citizens employed to protect property belonging to the corporation.

Objection is made that the Pinkerton force is specially odious. We have no doubt that is so. But this is not a question of taste. A legion of heaven's angels, notwithstanding the superiority of their moral character over that of the Pinkerton men coming on the same errand at the same time would have met with no better reception at that time.
