Peoples Party County Convention

A Delegate Convention of the Peoples Party for the county of Nobles will be held at Rushmore, Tuesday, Sept. 4, 1894, at 11 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for the following County offices: Auditor, Treasurer, Register of Deeds, Sheriff, Judge of Probate, County Attorney, Clerk of Court, Surveyor, Coroner, School Superintendent, County Commissioner, and County Commissioners for the 1st, 2nd, 4th, and 5th Districts; also to elect nine delegates to represent Nobles County in the Convention of the 7th Legislative District, to be held at Edgerton, Minn., on Sept. 11th, 1894, and for such other business as may properly come before it.

The basis of representation will be two delegates at large for each voting precinct and one additional for each Fifteen (15) votes or major fraction thereof cast for Ignatius Donnelly for Governor at election of 1892.

The different precincts are entitled to representatives as follows: Adrian, 4; Bigelow, 3; Bloom, 2; Dewald, 3; Ellsworth, 2; Elk, 3; Grand Prairie, 3; Graham Lake, 3; Hersey, 3; Indian Lake, 3; Larkin, 3; Leota, 3; Lismore, 5; Little Rock, 3; Lorain, 3; Olney, 3; Ransom, 2; Seward, 2; Summit Lake, 3; West Side, 5; Wilmont, 4; Worthington Township, 3; Worthington 1st dist., 4; Worthington 2nd dist., 3.

All voters who endorse the platform adopted by the Peoples party state convention held at Minneapolis, July 11th, 1894, are requested to meet in their voting precincts, at their usual place of holding elections, on Saturday, Sept. 1st, at 7 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of electing delegates to this convention.
