EXCITEMENT IS SOMEWHERE ELSE

For There is None in Alaska Over the Boundary Survey.

DENVER, Col., Nov. 22.—Joseph Murray, United States commissioner of fisheries in Alaska and special agent of the treasury, has just passed through Denver on his way from Alaska to Washington, having been summoned by the president to report upon the boundary survey which has been the cause of national interest within the past month.

In an interview with a representative of the Associated Press, Mr. Murray said: "The published reports about excitement in Alaska, British seizures and the building of forts are all boah. There will be no trouble.

Mounted Police an Excellent Thing. There are no armed forces there, excepting about 25 Canadian police and a better lot of men or more useful detachment for either the Canadians or ourselves, never went into Alaska. They have gone to the head of the Yukon river to watch for highway thieves who are infesting the gold camps. So far from there being a guerrilla fight and 'excitement at fighting pitch' the folks up there hardly know there is a survey running, and none of them know its real intention. As for the details of that survey, you will have to wait until Washington announces it, for I cannot say a word."

MR. WILSON'S ANNUAL REPORT

A Deficiency of Over \$10,000,000 in the Postoffice Department. WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Postmaster General Wilson made his first annual report to the president. The receipts of the postoffice department for the year ending June 30, 1895, were \$78,171,090, and the expenditures \$88,790,172. It is gratifying, says the report, that a large portion of the deficiency occurred in the first quarter of the year and that revenues are increasing with returning prosperity. Mr. Wilson estimated the revenue for the year ending June 30, 1897, at \$89,793,120, and the expenditures at \$94,817,900, the difference to be made up by congressional appropriation.

Accidents to Railway Postoffices.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—The report of James White, superintendent of the railway mail service, shows that during the year 497 accidents occurred to railway postoffices in which seven clerks were killed and 178 injured while on duty; an increase over last year of 137 accidents and 27 clerks killed and injured.

THEY WILL NAME A TICKET

Silver Democrats Propose to Go Into the Presidential Campaign.

CLEVELAND, Nov. 25.—The silver Democrats of Ohio propose going into the presidential campaign next year. Judge E. J. Blandin of this city, who stands close to Allen W. Thurman of Columbus says that plans are being formed for the nomination of a silver candidate for the presidency. A conference of the silver men will be held in January either at Chicago or in Washington to arrange for a convention to be held in April next. It is proposed to nominate Sibley of Pennsylvania for president and some Western man for vice president. "With these candidates," said Judge Blandin, "we will go to the Democratic national convention and ask for their endorsement. If the Democrats refuse to endorse the ticket we name we shall make an independent campaign."

Hanged to a Doorknob.

ROME, N. Y., Nov. 25.—George Payne noticed a rope tied to the knob of his mother's room. He opened the door and found his mother, aged 65, dead. She had hanged herself to the doorknob. Mrs. Payne's husband committed suicide in April last. This and her ill health, it is believed, led to the suicide.

Prospectors Perish.

MAZATLAN, Mex., Nov. 25.—The dead bodies of five men, two of whom are Americans, have been discovered northwest of here in a wild section of the Sierra Madre mountains. The bodies are supposed to be those of those of a gold prospecting party who left here several weeks ago.

Did Work Expeditionally and Quietly.

MOLINE, Ill., Nov. 25.—Some time between midnight and morning, robbers entered the State Bank of Alpha, a village 84 miles southeast of here, securing \$4,700. The men accomplished their work with the greatest skill, and attracted no attention.

Burned Houses and Horses.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 19.—A fire which broke out in the livery stable of J. R. Koon on Fourteenth street burned a dozen houses. Twenty-five horses perished in the stable and Mike Sheehan, was fatally injured by falling timbers.

Stuart After Fitzsimmons.

EL PASO, Tex., Nov. 19.—Dan Stuart has left here for Dallas to have Fitzsimmons sign for a fight with either Corbett or Malier in the Juarez bull ring, which will be enlarged to 10 times its present size.

Turkmen Get in a Scrap.

LEXINGTON Ky., Nov. 23.—George Cadwallader, the well known Turkmen of Milldale, Ky., attempted to shoot Joe Chinn, a Lexington Turkmen, in the lobby of the Phoenix hotel. Chinn saw him reach for his gun and knocked him down, causing the blood to flow freely from his nose. Cadwallader was arrested.

Three Fatally Burned.

WINSTON, N. C., Nov. 23.—Thomas Mabee and his two sons were fatally burned by a fire which destroyed their brandy distillery near Danbury in Stokes county.

To Open Red Lake Reserve.

CROOKSTON, Minn., Nov. 22.—The Crookston Commercial union, in a special session, resolved to call a convention to be attended by delegates from each town and village in this part of the Red river valley to take action looking to the early opening of the Red Lake reservation.
