

The Carter Fence Machine will weave and number of wire spaced at any distance apart, making a fence as close or open as desired, and will weave cross wires on either smooth or barbed wire, twisting the cross and main wires together in such a manner as to make it impossible for either to be moved. With a little practice one man can weave from 80 to 60 rods per day, after the wires are stretched. It makes the cheapest and most durable fence on earth. There is no spooling device to bother with, and no heavy, cumbersome rig requiring a wagon to haul it from place to place, but a light, hand machine, weighing only thirteen pounds, which works to perfection, weaving on a large cross-wire from a straight piece, thus saving its strength from being bent and straightened.
