Hick's Predictions.

Of the weather for June Prof. Hicks says: June will come in the culminating stage of a storm period which begins the last days of May, with intensified electrical storms and followed by a marked change to cooler. Return of storm conditions 4th to 6th, followed again by cooler. Regular Vulcan storm period extending from 8th to 13th and central on the 12th, nights illuminated with electrical storms for days in succession. About Sunday the 9th to Wednesday 12th many electrical storms, with rain and possible violence, will most likely occur. Showery and unsettled weather is probable to 18th, with very warm muggy weather. Vulcan storm period 20 to 26, intense and vivid electrical storms with occasional cloudbursts. Some narrow localities will have to much rain and

local floods; but immediately after we pass out of June rains it will be found that the greater part of the country is short of moisture, and general rains will be needed to mature the crops in most central, western and northern sections. Some of the most decided storms of the month are probable about 21st to 25th, with heavy storms of rain, thunder and lightning. Mouth closes in a reactionary period, with cutting showers and electrical storms in various sections.
