## STATE NEWS

The biennial session of the Women's Federation of Clubs, has been held at St. Paul during the past week. It is estimated that nearly 5,000 club women have been in attendance from various parts of the country.

From evidence received it is not believed that E. D. Holmes the missing ex-post master of Frazee, who disappeared on his way to Canada, committed suicide by hanging near Portal, N. D.

The 8 year old son of J. Wood residing near Anoka was drowned in the Mississippi. He slipped on the muddy banks and fell into the swift current.

T. W. London, who stabbed Florence Fleet at Bandette two weeks ago, has pleaded guilty to assault and was fined \$300 and sentenced to six months in the penitentiary.

During a fire at Stillwater which destroyed a brick block, three fire men were seriously injured by being buried under falling walls.

Mrs. A. A. White of St. Paul, received fatal injuries in a runaway accident.

Fred Brocht, a farmer residing near Granite Falls, died of heart failure while driving cows.

John Sylvis, attempted suicide rather than face a charge of contempt of court.

Minneapolis dogs must be muzzled is the order of Dr. Bracken of the state board of health.

Lamberton is holding a two days festival this week. Today the dairy and creamery interests are the center of attraction and tomorrow is bargain day, with sports and music on the side.

While gathering drift wood along the St. Croix, river Lloyd Crawford, of Plainview, fell into the river and was drowned.

M. C. Hawkins, an employee of the A. H. Anderson employment agency, St. Paul is missing and so is \$200 of his employer's cash. In addition a number of forged checks have shown up.

Owatonna papers are kicking vigorously because the people of that city have not been sufficiently liberal in their contributions for a Fourth of July celebration.

A project is planned to unite the towns and cities in Waseca, Steele and Rice counties by an electric railroad.

Dr. J. F. Force, former president of the Northwestern National Life Insurance Co., of Minneapolis has been convicted of misappropriation of funds by the Hennepin county courts, and now the company has brought civil action to recover something like \$200,000, which the genial doctor is alleged to have secured.

The strike of the telephone line-men of the state, which has been in progress for two or three weeks, has been called off.

Two deaths from lockjaw were reported in Minneapolis last week.

The South St. Paul packing houses loudly protest that their products are absolutely free from taint of every character. This protest comes as a result of the Chicago exposures, which have caused a large falling off in the demand for packing house products.

The recount of votes cast at recent city election in St. Paul has disclosed some errors and resulted in a slight gain for the defeated candidate for mayor, but not sufficient to change the result or to justify the claim of wholesale fraud.

An electric railroad is to be built this season connecting Buhl, Chisholm and Hibbing.

Ben Buck, a farm hand residing near Trosky, committed suicide by hanging. No cause assigned.

Ed Steelsmith, of Fairmont had the sight of one eye destroyed and the other badly injured by the explosion of a can of concentrated lye over which he had poured hot water.

David A. Hughes, a lad at Mankato, was instantly killed by a fall through a register hole in the floor of his grandfather's residence.

George W. Sikes, a former editor of the St. Paul Globe, is dead at Butte, Montana; aged 49 years.

An unknown man shot and killed John Kevister, bartender in a Hibbing saloon, shot and fatally wounded John Beckas, who pursued him and then committed suicide.

A reward of \$400 has been offered for the arrest of Harry Spencer wanted at Minneapolis for the murder of his wife.

Miss Ida K. Rohrer, a teacher in the public schools at Eveleth, shot and killed herself because she had made a failure as a teacher. Her home was at Spring Valley.

Mrs. Casja Eckman, aged 100 years is dead at Cokato. She was a native of Sweden.

Thomas H. Crume, bartender in a Moorhead saloon, was shot and killed by Alexander Anderson whom he had refused a drink.

thington close so early that farmers cannot get to town after the day's work is done, to do any trading, and that as the merchants do not care enough for their trade to accommodate them in this respect they have resort to catalog houses. This excuse seems so fetched, inasmuch as it takes from one to four weeks to get supplies from Chicago, and local stores are open at least one night in the week late enough to accommodate even the most tardy customer, and some stores are open every night as long as there is a customer in sight. However, the merchants should show the greatest consideration for farmers in this respect, specially during the busy season.
