Richmond, Va., Dec. 23.—There is talk of the Legislature completing its work and adjourning within three or four weeks after it reassembles on January 6. Some very prominent Virginians not in the General Assembly have been here and urged early adjournment. All the Republicans and Populists would vote against calling a convention and chances are that the question, if put to a proper vote, would be overwhelmingly defeated. 
