SPANISH BARBARIETY. KEY WEST, FLA., August 13.--A letter from Havana states that a passenger who was forcibly taken last month from the British steamer Elder, when Ponce Rico, by the Spanish authorities, proved to be a Colonel in the Spanish service. He was brought ashore and soon afterwards shot. All the Foreign Consuls protested against the act. No news of this arrest and execution was allowed by the censorship in Havana to pass over the wires.

Nothing has been heard of Hobkirk, the missing cashier of the Corn Exchange Bank of Waupun, Wisconsin, and no doubt is now felt that he has absconded, taking with him all convertible assets of the bank. The amount due to depositors is \$50,000, and to others \$15,000. The depositors are mostly all farmers living in Dodge county. Hobkirk is believed to have lost heavily in wheat speculations.

REMAINS OF THE LATE NORTH CAROLINA STATESMAN. NEW YORK, August 13.--A Saratoga special left for Hillsboro, N. C. A special from Raleigh, N. C., says the Ex-Gov's remains will arrive there this evening, and will lie in state at the Capitol until seven o'clock, when they will be conveyed to Hillsboro for interment. Business is to be suspended while the remains are in Raleigh.
