Tramp Killed at Plainville.

Coroner Maley this morning received a telegram from Plainville, on the Little Miami railroad, notifying him that a tramp, whose name they had been unable to learn, had been run over and killed by the Loveland accommodation train about 11 o'clock last evening.

The man was in company with several other tramps, walking along the track on their way to this city.

The engineer whistled for Plainville Station, not knowing that anybody's life was in danger; the others in the party, warned by the signal, made good their escape. This unfortunate man seemed not to hear or not to heed the warning, and was struck by the engine, thrown upon the track and crushed almost to mince-meat, his head being almost a shapeless mass. The coroner will hold an inquest this afternoon.

The Protestant League on the Public Schools.

The Protestant League of the Free Christian Congregations of North America, in its session in this city, adopted a series of resolutions, requesting the new Legislature to enact certain laws regarding the public schools. The substance of the proposed laws is given in the following selection from the proposed form:

1. All parents or guardians shall be compelled to send their children or wards, at least until they have reached their thirteenth year, regularly to a public or private school.

2. Those parents or guardians, who either neglect to comply with, or do not submit to this regulation, shall be subjected to fine, to be fixed by law, and in cases of repeated delinquency the fine shall be increased.

3. The Government of the State shall supervise not only the public, but also private and parochial schools.

4. The State has not the right to interfere with religious education. The examinations of the District-school inspectors shall therefore include none of the branches of religious instruction. The State School Board shall, however, watch over the moral condition of schools in general, and of the public in particular.
