HOLIDAY business active.
The "Two Orphans" is played in German at Turner Hall, this city.

TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY homeless wanderers at Hammond-street Station last night. One hundred and eighty at Bremen-street.
A MEETING under the auspices of the Sunday-school Union of the M. E. Church, will be held in St. Paul's Church to-morrow evening.
BY REV. STUART ROBINSON, D. D., of Louisville, Ky., will preach in the Second Presbyterian Church to-morrow morning and evening.
THE topic for the evening lecture by Rev. P. B. Morgan, at St. John's P. E. Church to-morrow, is "Can you prove the Bible true?"
A SPRINGFIELD breech-loading rifle, caliber 45, was received yesterday by the Cincinnati Light Guard, and its shooting qualities will be tested at Glendale Christmas Day.
THE total income of Capt. Harry Wright's Base-ball Club last season was \$37,767, and the expenses were \$24,505. Messrs. Spaulding, McVey, White and Barnes have retired from the club.
A FIRE was discovered this morning at 2 o'clock in the building at the southwest corner of Fifth and Vine streets. The fire was between the roof and ceiling of a room occupied by Pat O'Donnell as a hatter. The engine soon put an end to the flames, the loss amounting to about \$300. Cause—a defective flue.
THE pupils of Mr. Otto Singer gave an interesting concert at Melodean Hall last night, assisted by Mr. Singer himself, who, in the concerto numbers, filled out the orchestra score on a second piano.
