After the war when all but a few of the roughest free eaters of the South were supposed to have accepted the situation in good faith, Wade Hampton was brought out, in 1868, in New York City, to make a speech railing the administration of President Blair. In the course of that speech, he remarked with peculiar emphasis:

"I want you (the Democracy) to register an oath, that if there is a majority of white votes, you will place Seymour the Blair in the White House, in spite of all the bayonets that may be brought against them."

This was practically denouncing the amendments to the constitution recognizing the citizenship of the colored man and conferring upon him the right of suffrage. No matter what the result, if Seymour and Blair received a majority of the white vote, they were to be placed in the White House. This was what Hampton then wanted the Democracy to make oath they would do. And the purpose was as plain as the purpose of the rebellion—to divide through the Democracy what they had lost in their own hands another time, when speaking before the Virginia Military Institute, Hampton was thus reported in the Richmond papers:

"Allying most touchingly to our martyred dead, he said that our grief should not be confined to the dead, but that they should fall in vain—that they should be the bright hope that success would crown the Blair in the White House, because that they had fallen in vain—the cause for which Jackson and Stewart fell, cannot be in vain, but, in Lewis FORD, would yet triumph. He proposed 'The Lost Cause' for which our soldiers died, and that our soldiers should be transferred to the list of States 'certain for Tilden.' Our own opinion would embrace a list in which there were no doubtful States, and would be as follows:
