

The National Republican Executive Committee have appointed the 20th of May, 1868, as the time for the assembling of the National Republican Convention, at Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the offices of President and Vice-President of the United States.

FINANCIAL LAWS OF OHIO. The Commissioners to codify and revise the financial laws of the State, have completed their labors, and their report, which is now in the hands of the printer, will be presented to the consideration of the Legislature.

THE REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF RAILROADS AND TELEGRAPHS. The report of the Commissioner of Railroads and Telegraphs has been submitted to the Governor, but from an omission in the law cannot be printed until ordered by the Legislature.

ALABAMA. Alabama has finished the work of making a Constitution, and is ready to submit it to Congress for its approval.

THE MEXICAN APPEAL. The Memphis Appeal declares that four years of civil war and its results have taught us at least this one lesson: not to leap too hastily to conclusions.

OHIO STATE FINANCES. The receipts of the Treasury during the fiscal year 1867 amounted to \$6,176,955, and were credited to the following funds: General Revenue, \$1,999,421; Canal Fund, \$32,348; Sinking Fund, \$2,243,276; State Common School Fund, \$1,325,923; State Military Fund, \$41,519; Soldiers' Relief Fund, \$188,722; National Road Fund, \$23,039; Soldiers' Claims Fund, \$116,528; Bank Redemption Fund, \$3,029; District School Library Fund, \$83.

THE VOTE OF KANSAS. The following is the official vote of Kansas on the proposed State Constitutional Amendment: For male suffrage, 19,650; Against male suffrage, 10,259; For female suffrage, 9,971; Against female suffrage, 9,209.

CONGRESSIONAL.

The House passed the Deficiency Appropriation bill, which appropriates \$118,392, rejecting the amendment giving 20 per cent. additional pay to clerks.

REPRESENTATIVE HUBBARD ASKED LEAVE to offer a resolution requesting the Committee on Retrenchment to investigate the expediency of reducing the pay of members of Congress to \$4,000, and mileage to 10 cents.

ANOTHER LARGE BATCH OF BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS were introduced in the House, among them, one to prevent depreciation of the currency, one to facilitate the resumption of specie payments, and two in regard to authorizing the payment of the duties on liquor partly in lawful money.

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SUMMARY OF NEWS.

GEORGE MARTIN, Chief Justice of the State of Michigan, died in Detroit, on Sunday.

COLUMBUS DELANO is at Washington, with his papers all ready, showing in title to Morgan's note.

IT IS SAID TO BE PROBABLE that the Democratic National Committee will select Cincinnati as the place of holding the National Convention.

THE CAUSE OF THE ACCIDENT is not known. The most probable theory is that the tin roof of the bridge was blown up and across the track by the terrible storm, which came on in the morning, and covered as it was with ice and snow, threw the engine off upon the timbers which were not strong enough to sustain the shock.

THE PARAGUAYAN FORCES, under the command of President Lopez, have assumed active offensive operations. Their first movement was a complete success; they attacked the Brazilian camp and carried it by storm, taking 400 prisoners and several pieces of artillery.

THE REPORTS BY TELEGRAPH state that both in Virginia and Louisiana there is great destitution and suffering.

THE KING OF DENMARK has issued a proclamation to his subjects in St. Thomas and St. Croix, informing them of the cession of those islands to the United States.
