Review of the Portsmouth Market for the week ending, Sept. 9, 1850. GENERAL REMARKS.—We have much satisfaction in announcing a decided improvement in the trade for the past week.

Wheat and Grain.—The transactions in flour have not been large. The market opened early in the week at \$3.60, but a slight decline was submitted, and sales were made at 3.50.

WHISKEY.—An advance is noted in Raw and Rectified Whiskey. Sales at 22c for Rectified.

COFFEE.—Since our last issue an advance of fully one cent a lb. is noted. Sales at 11 and 11 1/2 are reported.

SUGAR AND MOLASSES.—Market is firm and sales are made at full prices. It is encouraging to our friends abroad to know that the selling rates are fully as low as the Cincinnati market.

Cincinnati Market. CINCINNATI, Sept. 7. Flour and Grain.—Flour is in pretty good demand to-day, but although holders generally resolutely contended for \$3.55 in the morning, buyers did not accede to their views and the bulk of the sales comprised 200 bbls in two lots, last evening and this morning from railroad at \$3.45; 50 do from river at \$3.50; 200 do from store at \$3.60; 260 do from railroad (late last evening) at \$3.50 delivered; 127 and 74 do from Whitewater canal at \$3.50.

Provisions.—The only sales to-day were 50 bbls No 1 Lead at 4 1/2 cts and 400 bags do actual rate at same.

Whiskey.—The market was steady to-day with a good demand. Sales of 504 bbls in lots from river and Whitewater canal at 23 1/2 cts.

Sugar.—We have no change to notice in the market which is steady and firm. Sales of 10 hhdts fair and good fair at 63 1/2 cts; and 20 do fair at 64.50.

Coffee.—A sale of 100 bags fair Rio at 11 1/2 cts cash. The demand is good and holders very firm.

Cheese.—A sale of 100 bbs selected W. R at 6c.

Saleratus.—A sale of 24 bbls at 4 1/2 cts. Molasses.—The stock is light and holders firm at 34 1/2 cts.

Freights.—There were engagements to-day at 60c for Flour to New Orleans; 90c for Whiskey, and 30c for Pound Freight to Pittsburgh, Whiskey 50c; Pound Freight 15c. To St. Louis Whiskey 50c.

New York Market. Sept. 5—P. M. Cotton firm with sales of 20,000 bales.—The flour market is heavier than yesterday and business is doing at a slight concession. Sales reach 8,000 bbls. Of wheat 5,000 bush prime white sold at 109 1/2 cts; 7,000 Ohio at 88 1/2 cts. Of corn 20,000 bushels sold at 60c for yellow. Pork is declining.—Lard 64 1/2 cts.

New Orleans Market. September 5—P. M. The market for flour is improving, and ordinary brands of Illinois and St. Louis command \$4.75. The stock in the market is only 5,000 bbls, and superior is in request. Corn is rather better, and we quote Yellow at 60c and White at 65. Mess Pork is dull at 21 1/2 cts. Sales of Bacon sides at 4 1/2 cts. The stock is large. Rectified Whiskey sells at 24c. Sugar ranges from 5 to 6. The market for Coffee is advancing, with sales of 3,000 bags yesterday at 10c. 500 hhdts of Tobacco were sold at somewhat better prices. Western Beef Cattle sold at \$5.25 to \$5.75, and Hogs at \$5.00 per cwt. net. Bacon shoulders bring 4 1/2 cts.

Navigation. NAVAHILL, Sept. 6—5 P. M. There are three feet water on the shoals.—The Richard Lee passed Eddyville last night. MARYLAND, Sept. 6—5 P. M. Weather clear and pleasant. River rising slowly. Steamer Brooklyn passed up at 12 o'clock last night for Louisville. Father Mathew arrived this morning and was greeted with enthusiastic welcomes. Cotton market dull owing to the small amount offered for sale. We heard of a few sales effected to-day, ordinary 10 1/2 to 10 1/4, middling 10 1/2 to 11. Bagging 10 1/2 to 11. Rops 8 1/2. Clear sides 6. Rib sides 5 1/2.
