PRESIDENT BUYS A VIRGINIA HOME.
President Roosevelt, it is reliably reported, has purchased a farm of one hundred and fifty acres in Albemarle county, and will use it for a summer home.
The tract acquired by the President is a part of the Springfield plantation, six miles from Scottsville and sixteen miles from Charlottesville. It is understood to be the object of the President to keep this place as the one spot where he and his family may get into the heart of the country, far from maddening crowds and the interminable rounds of official duties and official worries.

The State Committee.
As already announced, State Chairman J. Taylor Ellyson has called a meeting of the Democratic Central Committee to be held in Richmond, on the 15th instant for the purpose of making arrangements for the State Democratic primaries to nominate candidates for the United States Senate and for State offices. Under the plan adopted by the convention in 1904, the primaries must be held not more than ninety days nor less than sixty days prior to the general election, so that the date must be between August 8th and September 9th.

THE DUTIES OF THE GOVERNOR OF VIRGINIA MUST BE INDEED VERY LIGHT. Our present Governor has plenty of time to canvass the entire state, in his effort to be chosen as the candidate of the democratic party for United States Senator. Mr. Montague in his attacks upon Senator Martin has only brought to light the good qualities of Mr. Martin and has really made more votes for Martin than for himself. The democratic party should rebuke Mr. Montague not only for spending the time which belongs to the Commonwealth in canvassing for himself, but for his abortive attempt to bring into disrepute one of the most prominent men in the democratic party. Mr. Martin, on the other hand, deserves great credit for remaining at his post until the Senate adjourned and in merely defending his own record when it was assailed by Mr. Montague. Every intelligent democrat knows that Martin had sufficient material to make a spirited attack upon the Governor of Virginia. This he has refused to do, and by his refusal has won the respect and confidence of his party and will receive a large majority of their votes at the primary.

MARTIN STRIKES BACK.
Senator Thos. S. Martin at Winchester Saturday night made a statement in reply to a speech by William L. Royall, formerly editor of the Richmond Times, in which the latter stated that Mr. Martin's first election to the Senate in 1893 was accomplished by money and influences exerted by the railroads.
Mr. Martin said: "I have read the newspaper reports of Mr. Royall's speech. Disparagement, misrepresentation, malice and vindictiveness have been the characteristic features of this campaign against me since its commencement. A few men can always be found adapted to work of that sort and willing to do it. Mr. Royall has made his contribution and it is worthy of him. It is not a rebash of charges which as I have always understood were inspired by him and were presented in the Legislature in December, 1893, immediately after my nomination by the Democratic caucus and before my first election. The charges were immediately investigated by a joint committee in the two houses of the Legislature appointed for the purpose and a majority of whom were my opponents and had voted against me in the caucus.
After a thorough investigation this committee made a report exonerating me and my nomination from any taint of wrong of any sort and completely vindicated every member of the legislative caucus who had voted for me. After this report had been made, the Legislature proceeded to elect a senator, when the report of the committee was approved by my receiving every Democratic vote cast in the body. Six years later the report of this committee and the action of the previous Legislature were approved again by my re-election by an overwhelming majority.
"Now, after the lapse of twelve years, these false charges are resurrected from the pit to which they had been justly consigned and are being paraded for campaign purposes on behalf of my competitor.
"Perhaps it is the best that they can do. Honest and fair-minded Virginians cannot fail to put the stamp of disapproval on methods of this sort."

THE VIRGINIA CLASSIS.
The Virginia Classis, Synod of the Potomac, of the Reformed church convened in St. John's church at Harrisville, Shenandoah county, at 8 o'clock on last Wednesday evening with a full attendance of ministers and laymen.
The opening service was conducted by the Rev. T. J. Haeker, D. D., of Roanoke. The retiring president, the Rev. T. K. Cromer, of Winchester, preached the sermon. The Rev. A. T. Wright was elected president, and Elder D. H. Sibert, of Martinsburg, W. Va., vice president. The pastor, the Rev. A. H. Smith, extended a hearty welcome to Classis in behalf of the congregation and assigned the homes.
The Classis is composed of 19 ministers and the same number of Elders, representing 16 pastoral charges. The several pastors read their parochial reports on Thursday evening. These reports showed the various charges to be in a prosperous condition. The subjects of Missions, Home and Foreign, Education, Orphan's Home, and Sunday schools, claimed the attention of Classis.
The consideration of Massanutten Academy consumed a large part of Classis' time and called forth earnest discussion. It was the unanimous opinion of the body that the school must be maintained, and liberal things were devised for its enlargement and better equipment.
The regular spring meeting next year, will be held at Mt. Crawford, Va. Rev. Dr. J. H. Hoffhins and Elder H. J. Seibert, of Martinsburg, were elected delegates to the Potomac synod, which will meet in Newport, Pa., in October of this year. The services in the Reformed Church on Sunday were very largely attended.
At the communion in the morning the altar service was conducted by Rev. N. H. Skyles and Rev. T. K. Cromer. The sermon was delivered by Rev. T. Haeker, and the communion was administered by Rev. Hoffhins.
The young people's service was held in the afternoon, when addresses were made by Rev. G. E. Woodard, Rev. J. S. Guy and Rev. W. B. Shalenburg. At 8 o'clock Rev. W. E. Hoy, D. D., missionary to Japan and China, delivered an able address on foreign missions.

Dr. Avirett's Address on Davis. "Confederate Memorial Day," (June 3d) was remarkable for many things. The ideal weather, the outpouring of people young and old; their enthusiasm still unquenched and unquenchable, in spite of forty intervening years, since the war, loaded down though those years have been, with momentous and monopolizing issues of their own; the painstaking preparations, the lengthy and beautiful procession, the touching and impressive feature of the re-burial of the carefully gathered dust of four Virginia soldiers who had fallen in battle; the exercises in the cemetery and the exercises in the court house; these and other details made the occasion a more than usually inspiring one. The feature of features of course was the address of the Rev. Dr. Avirett on Jefferson Davis. Space forbids an extended notice, or anything like an adequate comment on its characteristics, but it was a sympathetic, animated and at times eloquent tribute to one whose title to greatness will grow brighter as the days go by. Dr. A. showed himself fully capable of demonstrating this. His fervent heart pouring itself out in noble thought and sentiment, into mold after mold of glowing sentences. He was enabled to present a picture of the Confederacy's first and only President, in a light which disarmed prejudices and brought out his career and achievements and character in juster proportions than are generally accorded him.
The writer feels that all who heard Dr. Avirett will join in expressing their indebtedness for his noble contribution to the beautiful and memorable day of a beautiful and memorable day.

HOMES WANTED FOR CHILDREN.
A Company of Orphan Boys, 10 to 16 years of age, will arrive at Woodstock, Friday, June 30th, 05.
Provided that at least twelve or more applications be made prior to the above date, by persons who can provide a good home, and are willing to take a boy upon a fair trial on the conditions herein given.
These boys come under the auspices of the Children's Aid Society of New York. They have been kept for a short time under direct personal observation, and only those have been selected to be brought so far, who give the promise of becoming, with proper guidance, a credit to the Society, to themselves and to the kind people who take them.
The conditions on which they are placed, are that all shall be properly clothed and treated as members of the family; those under 14 to be sent to school, and to remain in the family until they are 18; those over 14 to remain until they are 17; those over 16 to remain one year. At the expiration of the time specified, it is hoped that an agreement will be made with their boy whereby they will remain with the family indefinitely.
If you apply for one, you should be prepared to satisfy the Society that you can be properly trusted to supply the comforts of a home, and the education and moral training, which will fit the boy to take a respectable place in the community.
It will be understood that you wish him to enter your home as a member of the family, and not as a servant; that he is expected to do his part of the work, and to enjoy his share of the advantages; that you intend to take the place of father and mother to him as much as possible.
The Society reserves the right to remove a child at any time for just cause, and to remove any found unsatisfactory, after being notified, within a reasonable time.
