Agreed To Salute The Flag

Quite a sensation locally resulted last week from a report that certain Mennonites from the settlement had instructed their children not to salute the flag. The men reported as having done this were cited by the local Council of Defense to appear and be heard in the matter, and all came. After a long discussion adjournment was had and their answer to be given Tuesday, at which time representative members, including the church authorities, appeared and stated that they had misunderstood the situation and had never intended to show any disrespect to the flag or violate any law of the State, and that their action in the matter arose from a misunderstanding of the meaning of the flag salute as prescribed by the school authorities, and that they, one and all, had instructed their children to salute the flag as other American children now in the schools are doing.

The Council of Defense, after hearing the entire story of these people, felt sure that they intended no disrespect to the flag or our country, but that their action was simply the result of a failure to grasp the meaning of the flag salute.
