**NEW SERVICE TO NEW YORK.**

The Memphis to Put on a Fast Train From the South to Gotham.

The Memphis road has completed all arrangements for a fast vestibule train service between Memphis and New York by way of Atlanta and Washington. The service will be inaugurated next Sunday, the 20th. The east-bound train will leave Memphis at 9:30 o'clock each night, reaching Atlanta at 11 o'clock the next morning and arriving in New York at noon of the following day. The run from Memphis to Atlanta will be made in fourteen hours, which is a pretty lively gait, and the record from Memphis to New York will be broken by about three hours. The trains to be used in this service are as fine as anything in the country, and are fully equipped with the necessary conveniences of a modern railway train. To the business men of the southwest, and to patriots enroute to Washington about the 4th of March, President Nettleton's improved service on the Kansas City, Memphis & Birmingham line will prove of much benefit.
