Niederlander's office yesterday at 4 o'clock to consider the offer. It was finally decided to accept it. The east Douglas avenue line will be extended to Clifford avenue, being a distance of one mile and a quarter from the present terminus. The amount of money to be donated by the citizens is \$2,500. If that amount is paid in at an early date the cars are to be running by the 15th of next November. The matter is now settled and College Hill is looked for a street car line. This has removed the only objection heretofore set up against that part of the city for residences. A prominent gentleman who has been visiting the city some days says that College Hill will in the future be the home for the moguls of the metropolis.
