MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION

For a special election in Wichita city, Sedgwick county, Kansas, in the matter of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Co.

To the Qualified Voters of Wichita City: Whereas, On the 12th day of September, 1886, there was duly presented to the Mayor and Councilmen of Wichita, Kansas, (said Mayor and Council being duly convened in regular session regularly called), a petition duly signed by two-fifths of the resident tax payers of Wichita city, praying said Mayor and Council to submit to the qualified voters of said city a proposition to subscribe thirty thousand dollars to the capital stock of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Co., all on conditions as set forth in said petition, which petition signatures being omitted, is in words and figures following, to-wit:

PETITION. To the Mayor and Council of the City of Wichita, Sedgwick county, Kansas: We, the undersigned, being more than two-fifths (2/5) of the resident tax payers of the incorporated city of Wichita, in said county and state, hereby petition the Mayor and Council of said city to submit to the qualified voters of said city above named a proposition to subscribe to the capital stock of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Company, a railroad company duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of Kansas, which proposes to construct a railroad into the city above named.

That said Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Company shall construct a railroad of standard gauge (including all necessary track and switches) into said city above named, and have cars running thereon from some point on the east line of Sedgwick county, Kansas, to said city, on or before September 30th, A. D. 1887. (Delays by act of God and orders of courts or justice being excepted.)

And we pray that said Mayor and Council, upon presentation of this petition, duly convene and make an order, which order shall embrace the terms and conditions of this petition, and such other conditions as said Mayor and Council may deem advisable, and fixing the time for holding a special election, which we pray may be held, as by law provided, and order that the Mayor and Council do cause to be printed and written on his ballot: "For subscription to the capital stock of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Company."

Each qualified voter voting against said proposition shall have printed or written on his ballot: "Against subscription to the capital stock of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Company."

And whereas, said board of Mayor and Council, in pursuance to said petition, being duly convened as by law provided, and after having examined said petition, found that the same was in due form, and was duly signed by more than two-fifths of the resident tax payers of said city, and duly made an order, granting the prayer of said petition, and ordering that a special election shall be held in said city on the 21st day of November, A. D. 1886, to determine whether said city shall subscribe thirty thousand dollars to the capital stock of said company, and issue bonds to said company in payment therefor, on the terms and conditions all as set out in said petition, and further ordering that in the event that a majority of the voters voting at said election, cast their ballots in favor of said proposition, and vote to issue bonds in payment therefor, then the city clerk of said city shall forthwith, for and on behalf of said city, subscribe to the capital stock of said company, and issue bonds to said company, and it was further ordered that if said railway company fully comply with the conditions of said subscription, then the Mayor of the city and the city clerk of said city, shall duly issue bonds of said city in satisfaction of said subscription to the extent of the principal and interest to be due and payable as set out in said petition.

And it was further ordered that the ballots to be used at such election shall be as follows to-wit: Each qualified voter, voting at such election in favor of said proposition, shall have written or printed on his ballot: "For subscription to the capital stock of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Company."

And each qualified voter voting against said proposition shall have written or printed on his ballot: "Against subscription to the capital stock of the Wichita, Cedarvale & Southeastern Railway Company."

And it was further ordered that such election be held on the 21st day of November, 1886, at the following voting precincts, to-wit: In the First ward—at S. W. Ford's livery stable on South Main street.

In the Second ward—at Hahn's carpenter shop on west side of Main street between First and second streets.

In the Third ward—at No. 118 North Market street.

In the Fourth ward—at A. Smith's carpenter shop, corner of Main and Third streets.

In the Fifth ward—at Seaman's real estate office on Chicago avenue.
