Local Option in New York.

NEW YORK, June 24.—Gov. Hill has signed the bill passed by the late legislature extending local option throughout the state to the extent of permitting communities which have prohibited liquor selling to also prohibit its sale at wholesale.

Simply a Family Matter.

WILLIAMSBURG, N.Y., June 24.—Geo. Wedder shot and killed Dr. E. H. Duggan, a prominent physician of this place, this afternoon. The affair is very mysterious. Wedder says it is simply a family matter and will be explained in due time.

Cholera on the Isthmus.

NEW YORK, June 24.—Advices from Panama, under date of June 15, say that Valparaiso to May 1st 87 cases of cholera had occurred. Of this number 628 died. In Quillote 1,959 cases had occurred and 1,062 deaths.

Double Murder in Ohio.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, June 24.—At North Industry, a small village in Stark county, Ohio, this afternoon, Conrad Doll, a coal miner, aged 45 years, killed his wife and stepson with a hatchet. Doll escaped after the murder and has thus far eluded capture.

Navajo Indian Troubles.

DENVER, June 24.—News is received from McElm, Utah, that on Wednesday last five Navajo Indians brutally murdered Amos M. Barton on his ranch and then robbed his store. There is much excitement and further trouble is anticipated.

Chet Smith Sent Up.

CHICAGO, June 24.—The trial of Chet Smith, the dramatic agent, who has been acting as a procurer for the vile dens of Hurley, Wis., reached an ending today. He was found guilty and sentenced to one year in the penitentiary. The prosecution was conducted by the Humane Society.

Liabilities vs. Assets.

CINCINNATI, June 24.—Louis Kennedy & Co., commission and grain merchants of Vine near Second, assigned this afternoon to James Pettibone. Liabilities are said to be \$150,000 with assets of \$14,000. Mr. Kennedy was reported to be in the Chicago wheat deal, and was a heavy endorser of Fidelity bank paper.

Demands of the T. P. A.

ST. LOUIS, June 24.—The Travelers Protective Association today passed a long series of resolutions demanding a number of concessions from railroads, among them the issuance of 1,000 and 5,000 mile tickets at materially reduced rates, and the uniform allowance of 250 pounds free baggage. Among the directors elected was John Roscoe of Kansas.

Raging Fire in Louisville.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., June 24.—Three alarms brought out the fire department to a fire that started in the immense tobacco warehouse of Sawyer, Wallace & Co., at Ninth and Main. The flames are raging ferociously, and seem to be spreading rapidly, and it looks like a great conflagration will result.

A Night in Jail.

CINCINNATI, June 24.—Messrs. Harper and Hopkins, of the Fidelity bank, spent the night in jail. This morning they were again making an effort to procure bail. It is said that Harper yesterday telegraphed to Mr. Whitley, of Springfield, asking him to come and go upon his bonds, but at that time that great manufacturing concern was taking steps for the appointment of a receiver.

Will Close July 2.

READING, Pa., June 24.—President Coolidge of the Reading iron works, today informed the company's employees that in consequence of their refusal to accept the proposed ten per cent reduction, all of the company's furnaces, tube works, rolling and sheet mills will be closed on July 2 for an indefinite period. This suspension will throw 2,000 hands out of employment.

Unvarnished Truth.

NEW YORK, June 24.—At the commencement of the Manhattan college today Archbishop Corrigan, who presided, was forced by the most persistent talk, to make an address. He referred to the speech that one of the graduates had made on the floor of the assembly and quoted Father and St. Francis Xavier to show the proper condition of the poor, stating that the existing improvement was wrought by the Christian religion, and concluded by saying: "The communists that now seek to speak abroad through the land is no longer directed against the poor, but seeks to oppress the rich."

The President's Proposed Trip.

NEW YORK, June 24.—A Washington special says: It is stated here that Mrs. Cleveland will precede the president on his intended western trip, going first to Madison, Wis., where she will visit the family of Postmaster General Vilas. The president will join his wife there in the second week in September and together they will visit Detroit, Jackson, Grand Rapids, Chicago, St. Louis and San Francisco.

More Trouble in Kentucky.

LOUISVILLE, June 24.—United States Marshal Gross returned from Taylor county, Kentucky, today, where he went to take initiative steps to collect taxes for the payment of county railroad bonds of the Cumberland & Ohio railroad, in accordance with judgments issued by Judge Howell E. Jackson, in the recent term of the United States circuit court. He reports the citizens of the county in very bad temper and determined not to pay taxes. Threat was made that the mandate of the court could only be executed at loss of many lives. Marshal Gross is determined to execute the judgments to collect taxes even if he has to call for United States troops to aid him in asserting authority.

OVER THE OCEAN.

England.

LONDON, June 24.—The yacht Gemata was sighted off Lizard this morning. She is nearly two days ahead of the other boats in the Jubilee race. The Gemata was proceeding under closely reefed sails. There was a rough sea and a strong head wind was blowing. The yacht Slesse passed Clare Island off County Mayo, Ireland, today. She was leading the Gwendoline and Aline which also passed the island.

Marquis Harrington in a speech at Manchester this evening referred to home rule for Ireland as being, for a time at least, decided against. He protested against the minority in parliament being allowed to further present legislation, especially denouncing that section of the minority directly associated with a foreign conspiracy aiming at the establishment of an Irish republic.

Mr. Geo. Vanderbilt having received urgent cable dispatches, started for Liverpool at 5:30 today enroute for New York.

France.

PARIS, June 23.—The Journal des Debats denies that the French and Russian ambassadors at Constantinople have sent a note to the Porte threatening that war would ensue if the Egyptian convention were ratified.

THE SENATE TODAY.

The senate today discussed the report of the committee on consumption of spirits. Mr. Cloud said that the committee had come to the conclusion that the drinking of spirits in France had reached such a height as to be a social danger. Alcohol was essentially a diabolical article, and it behooved the state to prevent its excessive consumption, at the same time securing the utmost profit to the treasury by the suppression of adulteration and other frauds. Mr. Rouverol approved the committee's report. He said the government would prosecute fraud wherever discovered, and that the revenue collectors would be instructed to take vigorous action against imposition.

NEW LONDON, Conn., June 24.—The four-mile straightaway race between the Yale and University crews took place this evening and was won by the Yale by 4:12 lengths. Time 22:20.
