FEELING EASIER. THE RUSSIAN MASSING OF FORCES BUT A SCARE. Merely a Move for Protection—The French Ministry Still Uninformed—Other Foreign News.

OVER THE OCEAN. ENGLAND. LONDON, Dec. 8.—A British steamer plying in Chinese waters was wrecked on Sunday on the east coast of the island of Hainan. Of those on board sixty-nine were saved.

GERMANY. VIENNA, Dec. 8.—Emperor Francis Joseph presided today at a military council. Count Kalnoky, the imperial minister was also present. He was decided not to summon the delegates for the present as Russia has apparently stopped her menacing movements.

RUSSIA. ST. PETERSBURG, Dec. 8.—Well informed persons assert that the Russian government's intention is to demand that public opinion in Russia is also in favor of peace. The Russian movements on the frontier consist merely of the re-arranging of troops and of the withdrawal of not with an aggressive intent, but for the protection of certain localities.

A DANGEROUS BOX. KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 8.—A Topeka special to the Times says that United States Marshal Jones received by mail this evening a small tin box. Efforts were made to open it by Colonel Jones, ex-Governor and Deputy Marshal Sarritt. It was finally taken down in the basement of the government building and when opened the contents were found to be a quantity of nitro glycerine and killed a dozen men. No clue to the perpetrator or his motive can be given except that the box was wrapped in a Denver Republican dated December 6th. The post mark was illegible.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 8.—The wool growers and dealers in conference here, today adopted a series of resolutions declaring unjust the present classification of wool by the railroads of the country, and directing that they be urgently requested to place wool in their new classification on a non-preferential basis.
