SOLD AT SHERIFF'S SALE

(From Saturday's Daily.)

Arthur Braun, of New York, yesterday bought at sheriff's sale the property of the Bradshaw Mountain Copper Mining and Smelting company for \$140,000. This property lies in the Peck district, and has been in litigation for many months past. Braun, who purchased the property, was a heavy creditor.

When sale to the highest bidder was first announced, Attorney Morrison stated that G. A. Treadwell and F. C. Beckwith claim the Copper Link, a claim in dispute with the company, and that D. J. Ryan claimed what is known as the Wallace or Iron King, which is in litigation.

The first bid was offered by Attorney T. G. Norris in the sum of \$100,000, which was followed by a bid from J. H. Robinson raising the first bid \$1,000. Then Judge J. J. Hawkins, representing certain of the creditors, offered \$102,000, and bidding became brisk, ending in Attorney Norris securing the property for his client for \$140,000. It is understood that Mr. Braun is buying the property for the Arizona Smelting Company, which is erecting an 80-ton smelter at Val Verde.

Outstanding claims in the sum of \$108,230.40 are held against the company as follows:

Arthur Braun, \$16,540.93; Bashford-Burnister Company, \$31,345; J. H. Smith, \$6,882.72; Colorado Iron Works, \$12,001.05; O. K. Meat Market, \$1,219.08; Delmar Copper Co., \$23,000; C. E. Minor, \$7,176; R. N. Fredericks, \$5,371, and the same as assignee of W. C. Brandon, \$4,462.65.

DANIELS ARRIVES FROM YUMA

(From Friday's Daily.)

Ben F. Daniels, the retiring superintendent of the territorial prison arrived in this city from Yuma this morning. He is, as has been announced, the new United States marshal of the territory, succeeding Marshal Myron McCor of this city.

Mr. Daniels was seen by a representative of the Gazette at noon today, and asked for a confirmation of the report of the proposed removal of the United States marshal's office from this point to Tucson. He stated that the office will be removed in a short time in accordance with orders to that effect received from Washington.

When asked if he had made up his list of assistants and deputies he stated that while he had, in part, decided upon his deputies, he did not wish to give out any names for publication. However, it is an open fact that Walter Gregory will be with him as one of his deputies, and it is understood that J. P. Wells, who has been in the office for the marshal for a number of years, will remain with Mr. Daniels.

Speaking of the removal to Tucson Mr. Daniels stated that he would not have time to move until after the term of the United States district court which will convene in that city July 10.

Mr. Daniels came in on business connected with his change of positions, and will be here until tomorrow night, when he will go to Tucson.

Gov. J. H. Kibbey and the members of the board of control will go to Yuma tomorrow night, where they will induct Col. Jerry Millay into office to succeed Mr. Daniel. C. H. Utting, secretary of the prison, who succeeds Walter Gregory, left for Yuma last night and Col. Millay is there, having gone down Sunday.—Phoenix Gazette.
