DECISION THAT VOLTERS WERE IN REGULAR ORDER Recommends That Sloan And Smith Be Seated At Chicago

PHOENIX, Ariz., May 22.—The Republican Territorial Committee today passed the Kibbey delegates to the National Convention. The committee in the parlors of the Ford Hotel, at 10:30, Vice Chairman Haggott presiding, J. C. Reed, of Maricopa, was named temporary secretary. Allen T. Sloan, of Santa Cruz, J. F. Cleveland, of Graham, and J. C. Reed, were appointed a committee on credentials. After a recess the committee reported, showing forty-eight members seated out of the territorial committee of sixty. The report was unanimously adopted. Vacancies on the committee, through death or departure, were filled. At the afternoon session, Allen T. Sloan, of Santa Cruz, E. S. Clark, of Pinal, Geo. Christy of Maricopa, W. H. Pater, of Maricopa, and H. H. Donnelly, of Yuma, were named a committee on resolutions. The report adopted unanimously was as follows: Resolved: That the Republican Territorial Central Committee of Arizona earnestly recommends that Hon. Edward L. Sloan, of Prescott, Arizona, and Hon. Hoyal A. Smith, of Bisbee, Arizona, the regularly elected delegates of the republican convention, be recognized and seated in the national republican convention as the rightfully elected delegates from the territory of Arizona to said convention, and that Hon. Con. O'Keefe, of Santa Cruz county, and J. E. Perry, of Mohave county, be recognized as lawfully and regularly elected delegates from said territory. Resolved: That said Territorial Central Republican Committee hereby recommends that Hon. Ben Heney, of Yuma county, Hon. Dell M. Potter, of Pinal county, Hon. J. L. Hubbell, of Mohave county, and Hon. John Dorgan, of Yuma county, who were lawfully and regularly elected by said convention as provisional delegates to the National Republican Convention, be recognized and seated as lawful delegates from the territory of Arizona in order that said territory may be represented at the national republican convention, and that J. F. Crowley of Cochise county; Chas. L. Martin, of Gila county; A. C. Sieboth, of Pinal county, Hon. H. C. Lockett, of Coconino county, be recognized as the provisional delegates of said last four provisional delegates. Resolved, That said Territorial Central Committee presents these recommendations and this resolution to the republican National Committee, fully convinced of the right and justice thereof, and with the earnest recommendation that the same be favorably considered and acted upon by the national committee. The meeting was absolutely unanime and harmonious. The remarkable endorsement of the members of the committee were selected when they and his friends were not accountable for their selection. The majority of the members of the committee from every county were present, the exception being Pima. Short Tenney was not present.
