

PARCELING OUT PIE EARLY IN THE SEASON

PHOENIX, Sept. 25.—Democratic rumblings as foreshadowing the hurling of many gages of battle into the lists, at some unfixed time this fall, indicate the wider spread of political planning, so that now, some idea may be gained of the sentiment of the leadership toward other offices than that of governor.

While it is well recognized that the governorship is going to be the center of the pre-primaries storms, there is not a little interest in the tradings and swappings for lesser jobs. For instance:

Mitt Sims, limited by law to one term as state treasurer, is practically conceded the right to carry the party's banner as a candidate for secretary of State. This is exactly as it should be from a democratic standpoint, for Mr. Sims is from Graham county, and Graham county is a demo stronghold that the leaders believe it will be well to keep conciliated.

For Sims' present position, wise ones are mentioning Jesse Boyce, secretary to the State tax commission. Here again, the geographical location of Mr. Boyce's unofficial headquarters favors the selection. Not since there was a State of Arizona has Coccino county had a man on a State ticket. And Boyce, hailing from Flagstaff, Williams and other nearby main-line points, is regarded as an ideal man for the candidacy; his position in the party and his work in State officialdom are said to have fitted him for the promotion.

Both State treasurers heretofore, have been from the south of the State.

One of them, D. F. Johnson, contemplates running again, as he has been "out" for one term.

All this yeaves it all the more apparent that Sid Osborn, present secretary of State, will be regarded as a candidate for the gubernatorial nomination.

The recent support of certain of the democratic press of the State given unasked to J. C. Callaghan, has irrevocably hurt his chances of contesting the nomination, according to some very frank democratic leaders. On the other hand, the auditor is credited with a statement in which he denies without reservation, his ambition to supplant Hunt.

It being practically certain that Wiley Jones will enjoy the squabble over the nomination for governor, the office of attorney general is left open to other applicants. Nor is there a dearth of well discussed material. Among the first to be mentioned, is Leslie T. Hardy, present assistant and the unsuccessful candidate in his party last election.

CAMERON VICTOR IN THE FIRST ROUND

(From Sunday's Daily)

Judge Sawtelle's action in the Federal court yesterday at Phoenix in denying the motion of the United States attorney to oust Ralph Cameron from the "Cape Horn" mining claim in the Grand Canyon is interpreted to mean that a location cannot be attacked by the United States land office before a patent is applied for by the locator.

The motion of the United States attorney had nothing to do with the other two cases that are pending in the Federal court in regard to alleged mining claims in which Cameron is involved. In the other cases patents had been applied for by Cameron and they had been refused by the land office, which also voided the claims.

Cameron holds that because the land office did not grant patents it had no jurisdiction and could not void the claims. This question in which amended bills of complaint have been filed will come up on October 11.

Word of the action in the United States court was received in Prescott yesterday by Attorney Robert E. Morrison, who is presenting the case with his brother, Attorney Joseph Morrison. It is as follows:
