## ARIZONA NEWS.

[Called from Exchanges.]

At Yuma last Friday, J. McDonald, a painter, died in a fit.

Cattle on the San Simon, above Solomonville are getting fat.

Monday night the Salt River was reported above the fording mark.

Large quantities of hay will be cut in the vicinity of Fort Huachuca.

Tombstone has been suffering the inconvenience of a fly-paper famine.

The assessment roll of Cochise Co. foots up \$2,913,031, a gain of \$122,000.

The electric lights of Tucson may be seen twenty miles away from town.

The prospector reports a rich gold strike in the Lucky Cuss mine at Tombstone.

The Copper Queen Co. has purchased another copper claim at Bisbee for \$15,000.

Reports of rich gold discoveries, both quartz and placer, reach Prescott from Stanton.

At Fort Huachuca, last Saturday, 1.25 inches of rain fell in twenty-five minutes.

The new building at the Fort Yuma Indian school as been completed. Its cost was \$4,000.

At Arivaca, Pima county, rich ore is being taken out of several very valuable properties.

There is an enormous amount of grain to be threshed in the San Pedro Valley this season.

At Mesa City the grape crop is very heavy this season, and growers are getting \$30 per ton.

In Pima county grass is growing finely, and cattle are looking better than for a long time.

Wednesday of last week a fine bar of gold from the McCabe mine was taken into Prescott.

Tuesday evening four car-loads of hogs were shipped from Phoenix to the California market.

One day last week Mr. Posey found a fifty dollar nugget in a cave in the Superstition mountains.

A twenty stamp mill is being put up in the Big Bug district, near Prescott, on the Henrietta mine.

L. O. Cowan has been appointed clerk of the district court for Mohave county by Judge Hawkins.

More rain has fallen at Fort Huachuca this year than during the previous three years altogether.

A movement is on foot to organize parlors of Native Sons of the Golden West at Tucson and Phoenix.

In the Dos Cabezas country rains have started the grass finely, and cattle are improving in condition.

Near Tombstone, last Friday, the barn of W. G. Green, and 100 tons of hay were destroyed by fire. Loss, \$5,000.

Vanderbilt & Palmer of Prescott, are negotiating a big deal with New York parties for a gold claim near that city.

Last Friday the San Pedro river was over its banks in many places. At Fairbanks the water was half a mile wide.

Days are more plentiful in the Dragoon mountains this year than ever before. Quail and rabbits however are scarce.

The Indians who frequent Tucson have learned to use their strong, heavy teeth to turn on water from the street hydrant, whenever they want it and cannot get a key.

Pima county officials are making it interesting for cattle thieves. Last week two were held to appear before the grand jury.

There have been several heavy rains recently between the Agua Fria and the Hassayampa, and grass is said to be waist high.

A Willer man has been sent to the insane asylum for preaching in Tombstone from daylight to 11 A. M., on Wednesday last.

At Tempe, Wednesday of last week, Charles Mullen was badly hurt in stopping a runaway horse, the shaft of the vehicle striking him.

Tombstone again revels in the luxury of a faro bank, which the prospector thinks a sure indication of approaching good times.

A peculiar feature of the range grass in Cochise county this year, says the prospector, is the thick stand it shows in nearly every section.

During the next two months several thousand head of cattle are to be gathered and shipped from the Sandy ranches, in Mohave county.

In Cochise county the cattle owners have petitioned the territorial board of equalization to reduce the assessment on cattle from \$10 to \$8.

Anson H. Smith of Kingman, editor of the Mohave Miner, has been appointed, by Governor Hughes, a director of the reform school at Flagstaff.

At Phoenix, Saturday night, lightning struck the works of the electric lighting company, and destroyed one of the posts of an incandescent dynamo.

At El Rio the Gold Rock Mining Co. has a force of men putting in a large pump for supplying with water the mines and mill, thirteen miles distant.

The Prescott & Arizona Central Ry. has passed into the hands of a receiver, A. T. Kelly having been designated by Judge Hawkins to act in that capacity.

The Bisbee railroad has been washed out heavily and no trains have run over it for a week. None are likely to run for a few days, as the rains are continuing.

An old-timer cattleman, Hor. M. G. Samanigo of Tucson, says the rains this season are better than any year since 1881. And the prospect is good for more rain.

A twenty inch vein of sulphurets has been developed in the Husted mine, on the Hassayampa, near Prescott, the ore from which assays \$385 per ton in gold.

Last week the Southern Pacific suffered severely from washouts on both sides of Arizona—near Deming and in the vicinity of Yuma—and traffic was greatly disarranged.

The Prescott Courier has private advices from Washington which state that the interior department entertains no intention of consolidating the Arizona land offices.

Sunday the Barbacomeri reached the highest water mark that has been known for several years. That river and the San Pedro have been on the rampage for a month past.

John L. Frost, a Southern Pacific fireman, suffered a painful accident at Pantano one day last week. The toes of his right foot were smashed by a brake beam falling on them.

It is stated that Huntington of the Southern Pacific, is negotiating to buy the New Mexico & Arizona Railway, which will be converted into a standard gauge and extended to Globe.

P. McCall of Tempe, has gone to Los Angeles to file suits in the California courts for Juana Walker, considerable property belonging to the Walker estate being in that state. It is stated that \$74,000, in Los Angeles banks, await the disposition of the courts.
