

District Court.

The district court of the first judicial district of Arizona, in and for the county of Santa Cruz, Hon. George R. Davis presiding, convened at Nogales at 9:30 o'clock a. m., Thursday, December 28th, 1899.

The sheriff was ordered to summon a grand jury of twenty-one qualified jurors, to be returned to the court at 10 o'clock a. m., Friday, December 29.

The sheriff was likewise ordered to summon fifty qualified trial jurors to report to the court Tuesday, January 2nd, 1900, at 9:30 o'clock a. m.

SANTACRUZ COUNTY

O. H. Moore has been appointed deputy sheriff at Washington Camp.

Word has been received that W. H. Hill a carpenter employed at the Duquesne mine, died in the hospital at Tucson Sunday.

Near Washington Camp on the 21st Frank Smith shot Prudencio Juarez. Smith was brought to Nogales by Deputy Sheriff Moore and lodged in jail. Juarez is reported in a critical condition.

It is credibly reported that on Sunday afternoon the home rancho building of the San Rafael Cattle Co., at Lochiel, was destroyed by fire. All were absent at the time and it is supposed that a burning log rolled out from the fireplace and set the floor afire. The loss was total, and must have been quite heavy for the structure was large, well finished and handsomely furnished.

Mr. M. H. Jones of Washington Camp has received letters patent upon a new device for retaining in the case railway coupon tickets in such a way that any ticket can be removed at will without in anyway interfering with the other tickets—an invention greatly needed in railway ticket offices. A descriptive mention appeared in THE OASIS early in the year, at the time Mr. Johnson made application for his patent.

Christmas night some freighters from Tucson with two ten horse teams stopped at the rancho of Mr. Edward Egan. They bought one bale of hay for their twenty horses; but during the night they helped themselves to other bales. They arose, hitched up and departed before day. Shortly afterward Mr. Egan noted his loss. He saddled his horse, followed the outfit into Nogales, presented a bill and collected it.

Thursday morning Mr. Geo. W. Atkinson of Calabasas, received from Judge W. H. Barnes of Tucson, attorney for the settlers in the Baca float grant No. 3 matter, a letter stating that advices from Washington conveyed the pleasing intelligence that the secretary of the interior had ruled that the settlers shall have thirty

days to show that the lands now claimed under the Baca grant, or any part thereof, have been ever covered by any other claimed Mexican grant.
