The operation of this plant will be of great service to owners of mines in the Hermosillo and Ures district, giving them a market for their ores close at home, with quick and ready returns. At present there is a single stack in operation, but a new 100 ton stack is in course of construction at Denver, and in the near future it will be added to the plant, when the present stack will be converted into a copper smelter, and the company will then be in the market for copper ores.
