

MINING NEWS.

A Collection of Short Newsy Items From Among the Mines of Arizona.

Prescott Courier: While in Kingman, a few days ago E. S. Clark attorney of this city, says that he had the first opportunity in his life to see what a big gold mining proposition is capable of doing, when he looked at a \$70,000 bar of gold bullion that was received in that city from the famous Tom Reed mine. This immense amount of gold was the result of an eighteen days run of a ten-stamp mill and while it created considerable comment, there was no surprise expressed over the massive size of this production. "In fact," Mr. Clark says, "gold bullion shipments into that city are of such frequent occurrence that it takes a big bar to create ordinary interest and instead of exciting the people, the occasion is regarded as more of a matter of fact condition to be regularly expected." This bar is said to have been the largest single one ever brought into Kingman; a strong guard was employed to safely land it at its destination. It went to the mint on the next train.

Globe Belt: Work will be started immediately on the property of the Lost Gulch United Mines Company. This property has been taken over by J. T. Harrington, who up to this time has been in charge for the company, and from now on will be worked by him on his own account. At the present time no further exploration work will be started, it being the intention of Mr. Harrington to work the ore that has accumulated on the dump before any further development work is attempted. This is a gold property located eight miles northwest of Globe, and about two miles north of the town of Miami. On the ground a ten-stamp mill has been erected and is in condition to start working immediately. At this time owing to the scarcity of water in that district no attempt will be made to run more than one shift a day. However it is the intention of Mr. Harrington to start sinking at once and endeavor to develop sufficient water to run the mill full time. There is considerable ore of good grade on the dump recent assays showing a value of from \$30 to \$50 to the ton.

Parker Post: Yuma county mines are coming to the front as never before, and this winter gives promise of opening the eyes of the home folks as well as outsiders to our marvelous mineral possibilities. The workings of the Old King is ancient history; the latter activity of the Golden Star is too new to need retelling. The more recent strikes and activities are on every tongue. Men of money are coming in on every train, and the prospector and the patient burro are on every side. The recent strike by Amos Adams in the Dome mountains is responsible for this sudden turn of the wheel and were his find in the icy hills of Alaska or the remotest corner of darkest Africa, the stampede would be great indeed. Now comes another, not a new strike, but the bonding of a bunch of old claims that are known to be rich, the Max Egasser claims, in the vicinity of the Old King, the North Star, the Alamo group and the latest find,

the Big Eye, or as the public knows it, the Adams strike. For over thirty years Max Egasser has toiled early and late on his claims, refusing many tempting offers for their sale, and undergoing many hardships and privations.

Globe Belt: The Inspiration Copper company immediately will start the sinking of a six compartment shaft near the entrance to its large working tunnel. This large shaft will be the main working channel for that portion of the great Inspiration ore zone lying beneath the level of the main tunnel. This is only further confirmation of the Inspiration company's intention to develop its great ore deposit on a scale commensurate with its unusual area. That this portion of the property, contiguous to the town of Miami, is to be the center of the Inspiration's future operations is further shown by the company's intention to start moving its offices from their present location to the vicinity of these main workings. Recent reports from the various engineers that have visited the property have been very conservative, the estimates being based on an average thickness of the ore body of two hundred feet, while, in fact, in a large number of holes the churn drills penetrated commercial ore to a depth of five hundred feet.

Prescott Journal-Miner: Considerable excitement is prevailing in the mining fields adjacent to Humboldt over the discovery of rich ore on the claims of Michaels, Scanlon & Hatch, and the returns of over \$1,000 a ton in gold, silver and copper received from a few tons treated at the smelter last week. Copper values lead, while the gold yield was also heavy and unexpected. Silver was shown in a nominal sum. The claim which gave these heavy values has been under development in a quiet way for about a year, and on the surface was regarded as attractive for only limited work. As depth was reached, however, the mineral characteristics were altered, and a strong vein made its appearance. The values also underwent a change, and at the deepest point became a bonanza. The owners are much elated at the discovery and state that it has all the indications of being a permanent one. The claim is located about four miles east of the smelter, and since the announcement of the find was made a rush has started for that section.


